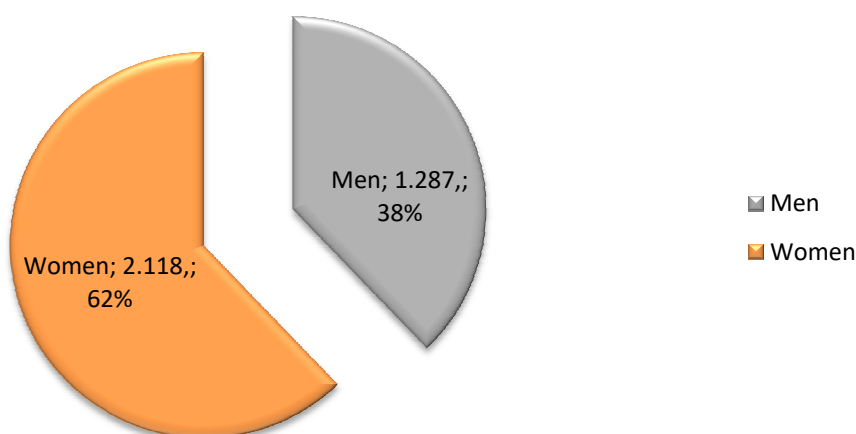
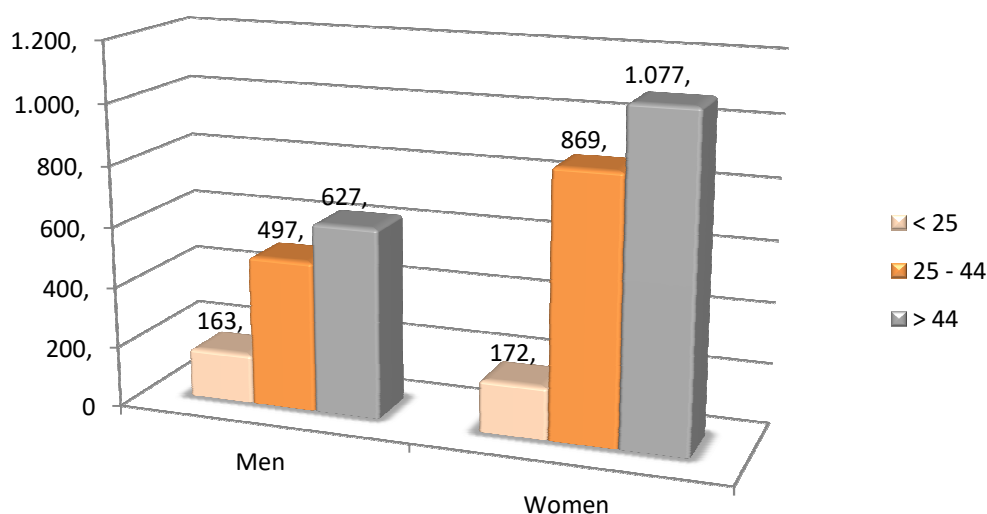
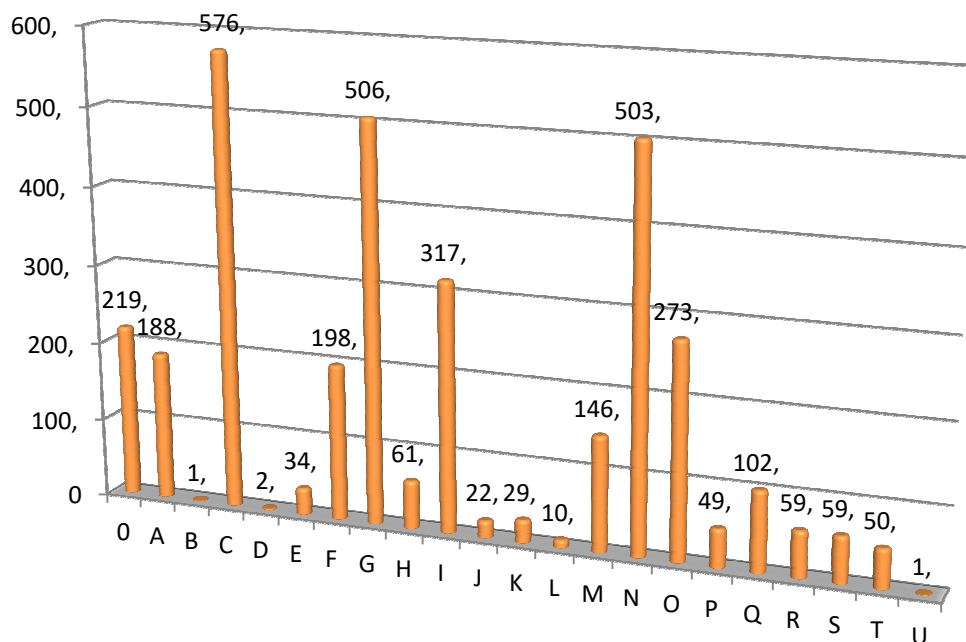


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

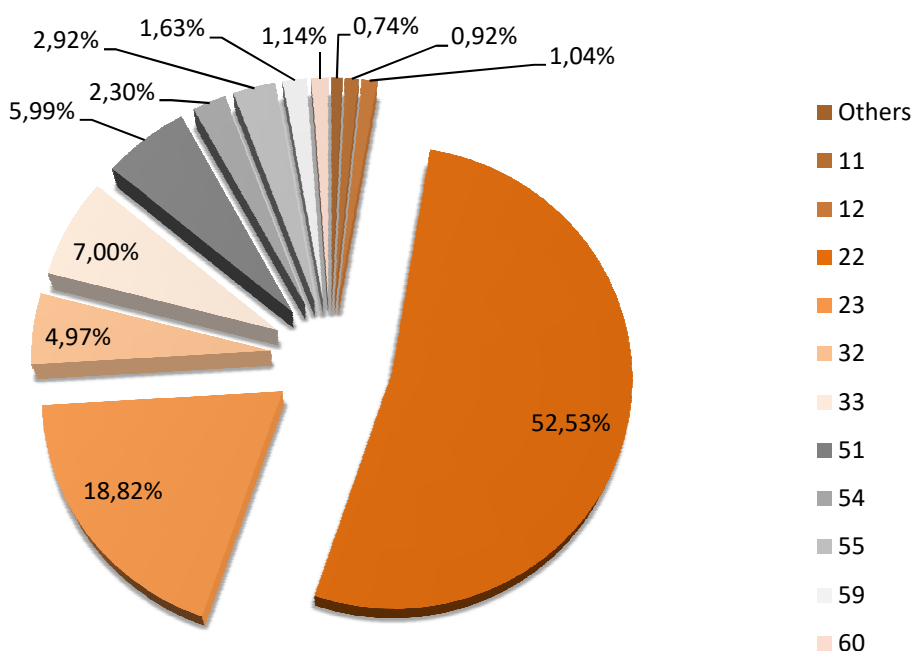


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



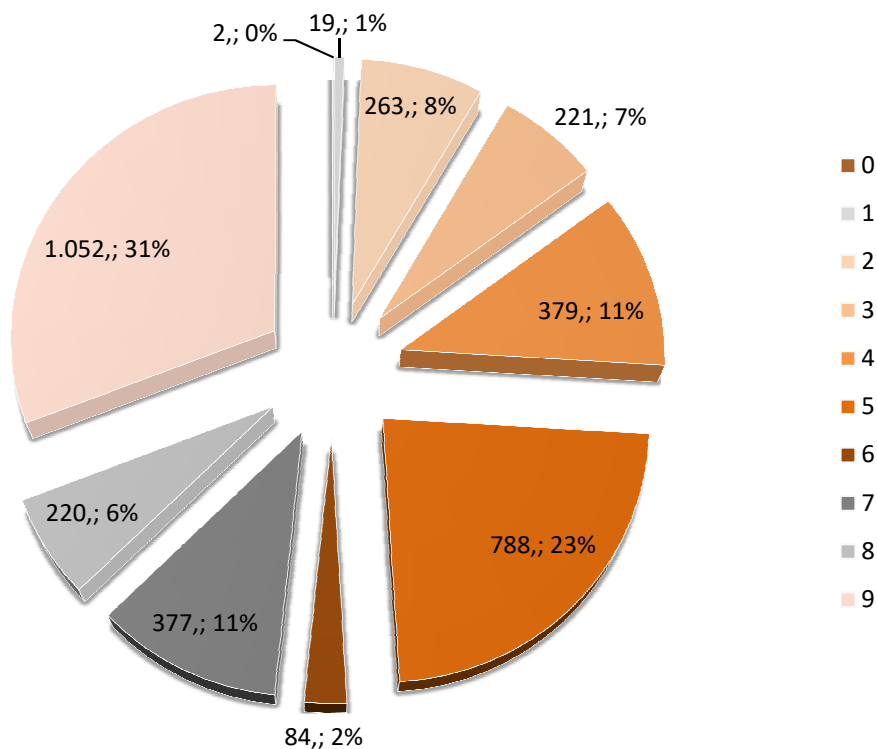

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



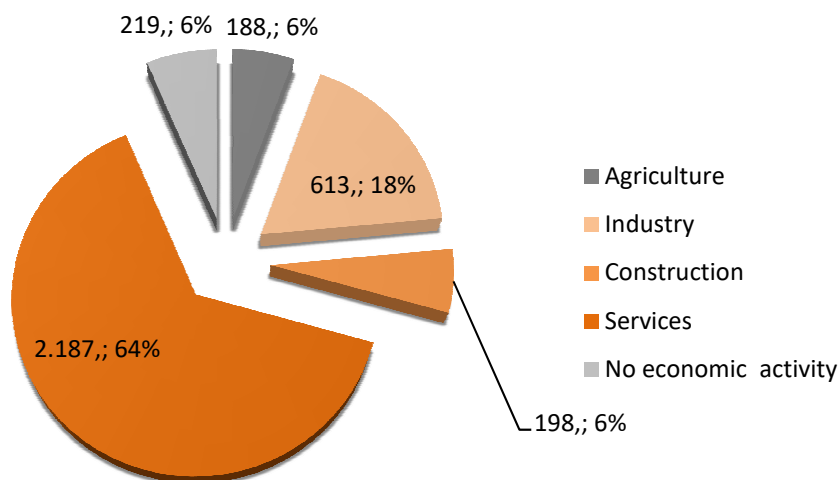

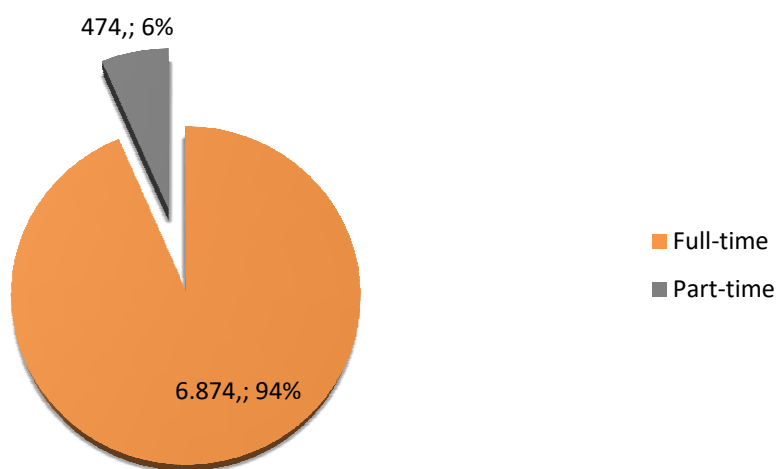

It is followed by people with a graduate degree or equivalent (18,77%). Subsequently, come the following education background groups: undergraduate degrees (6,37%); higher education (5,64%) in specific vocational training, plastic art and design and sports. 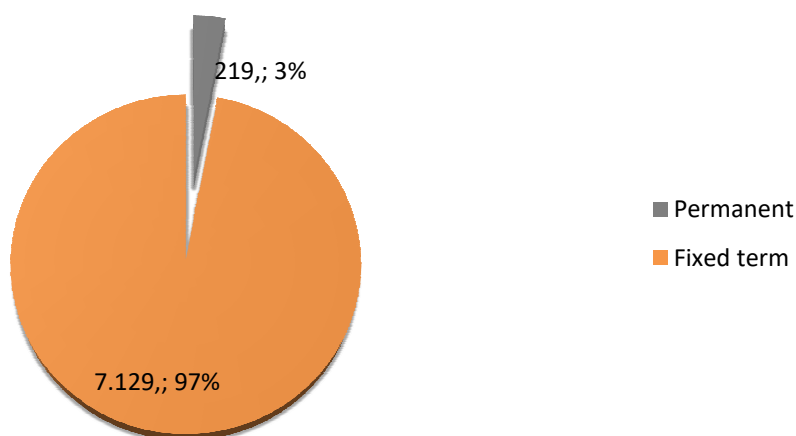

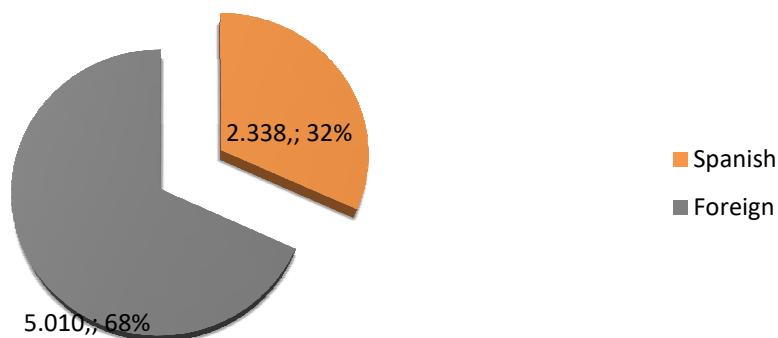
Graph 7. By type of working day



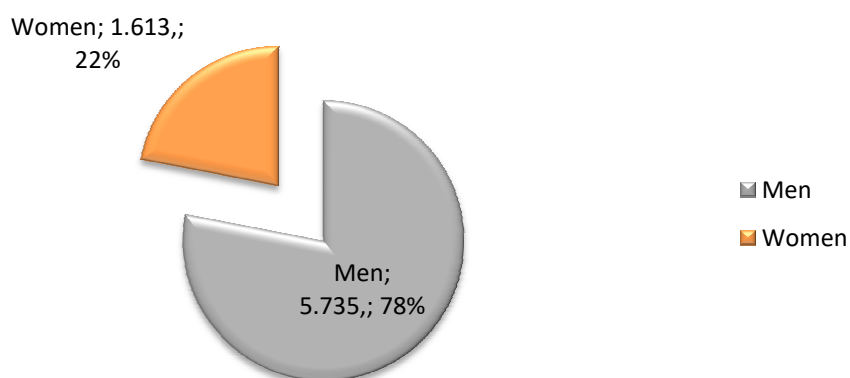

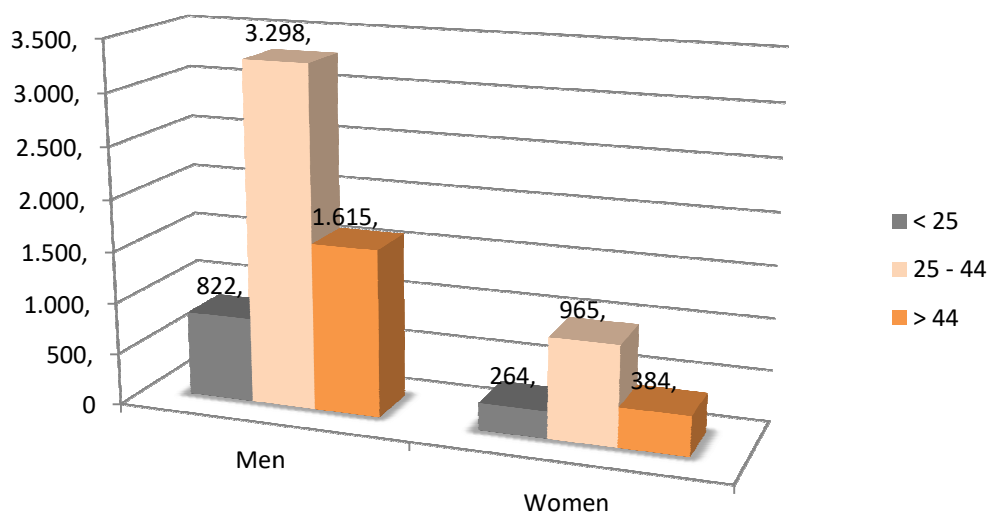

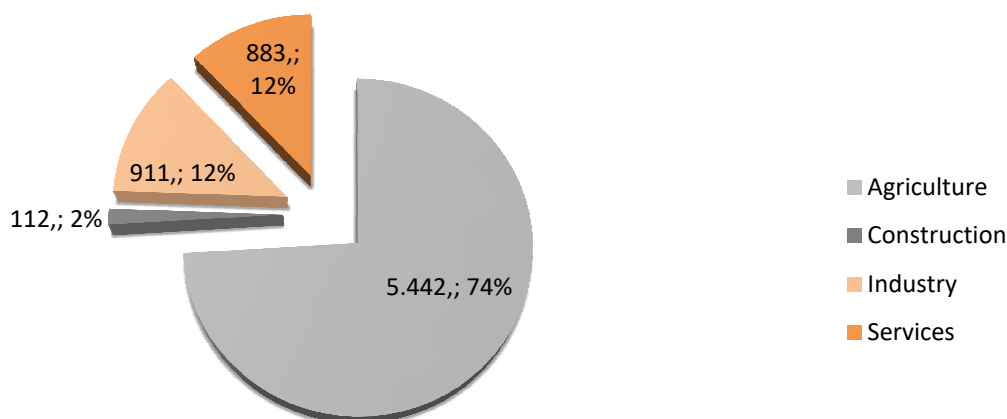

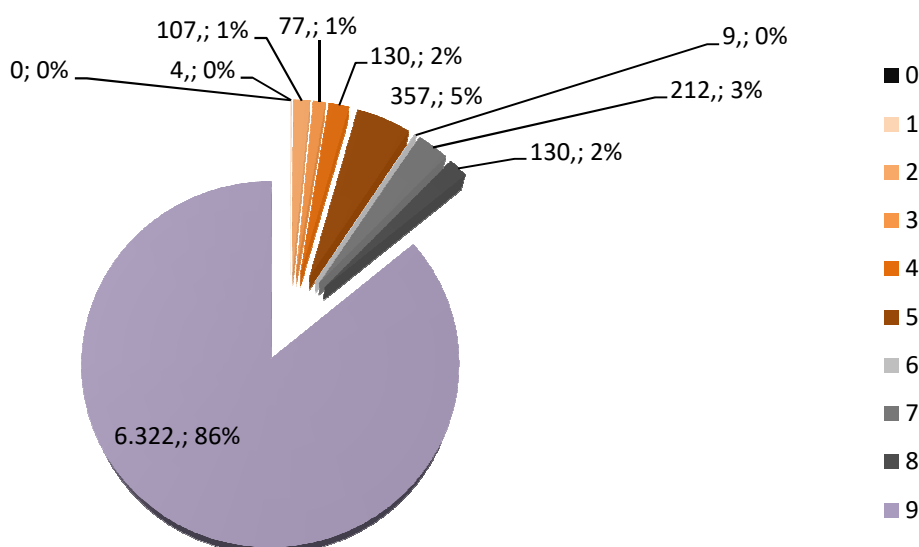

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

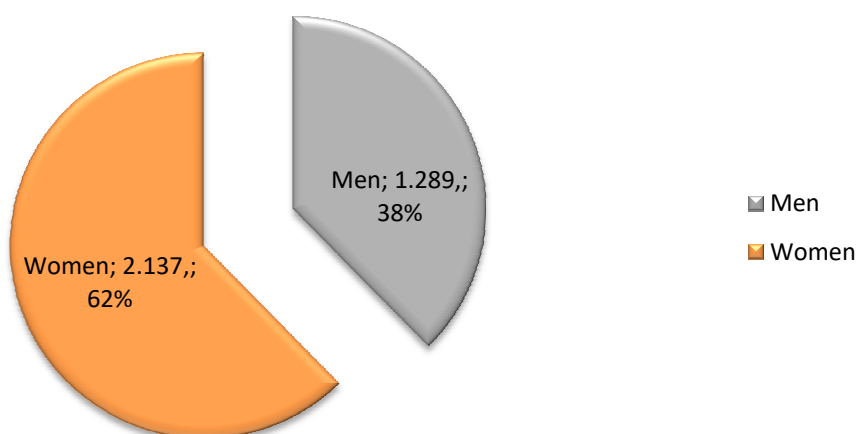
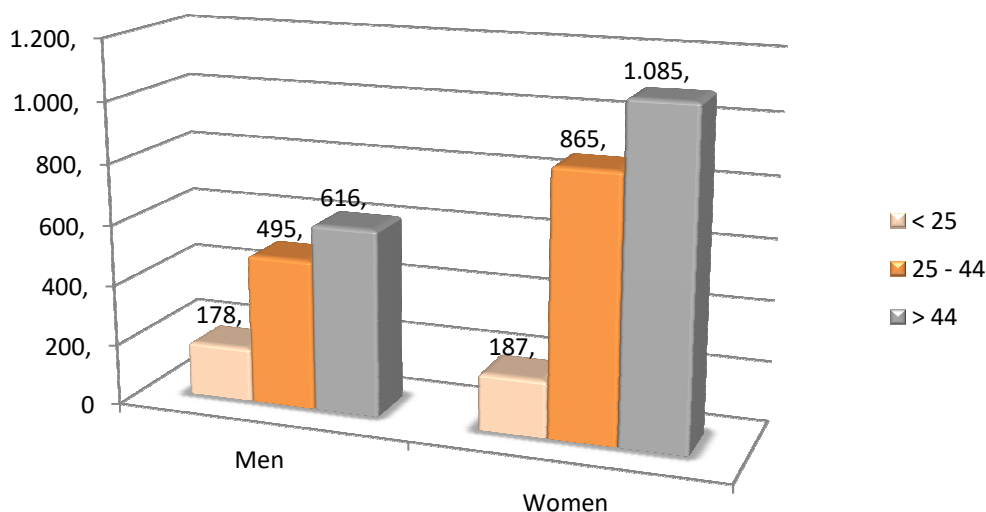
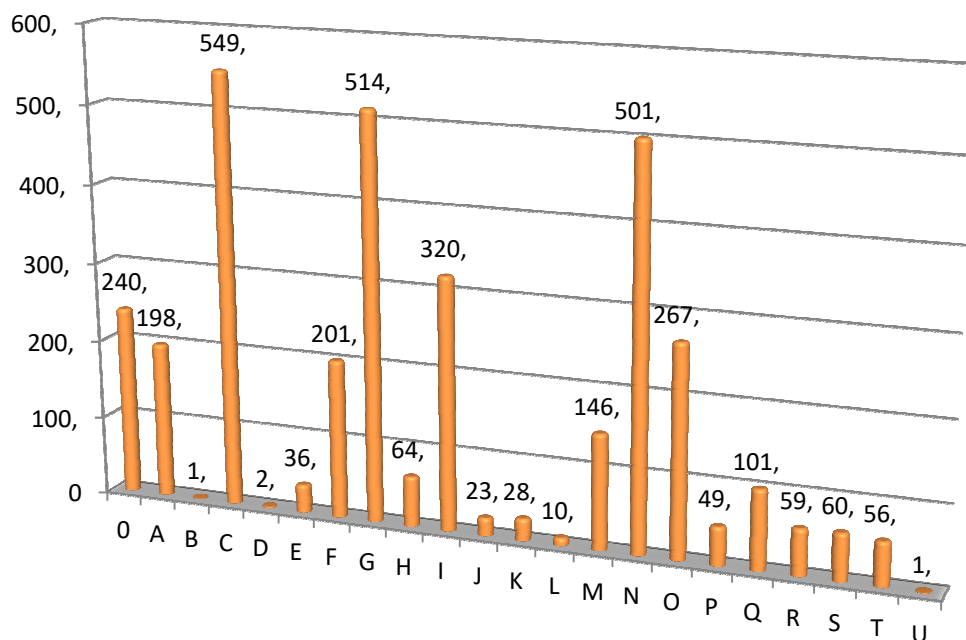


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

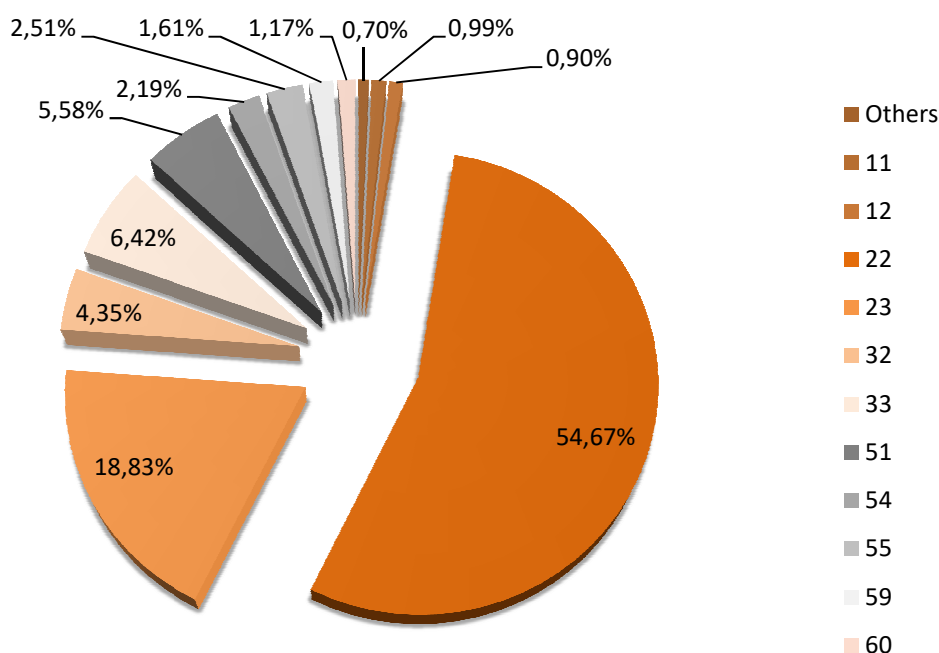


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



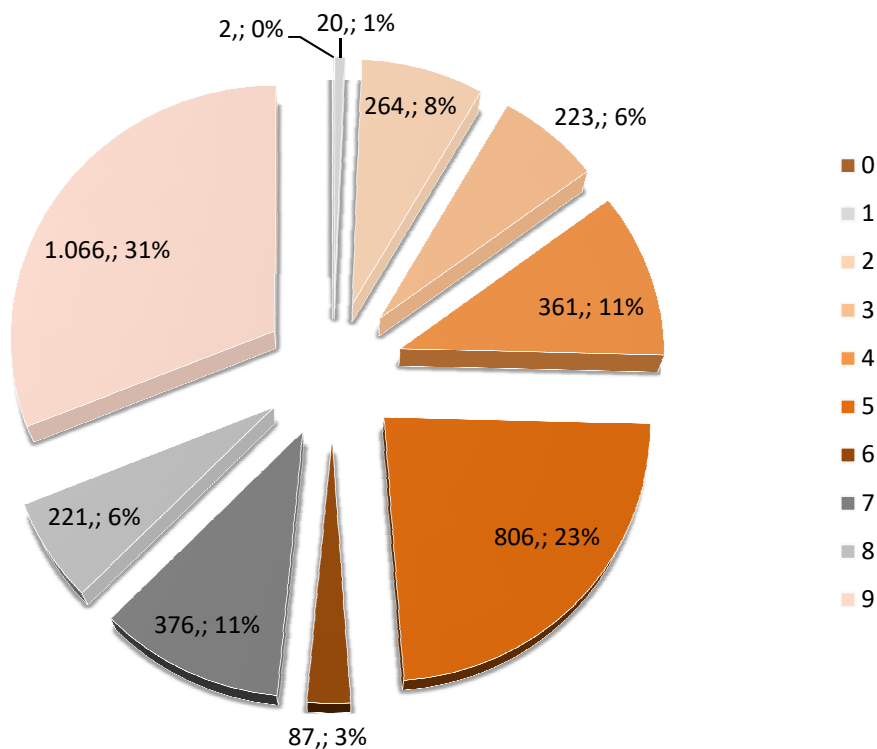

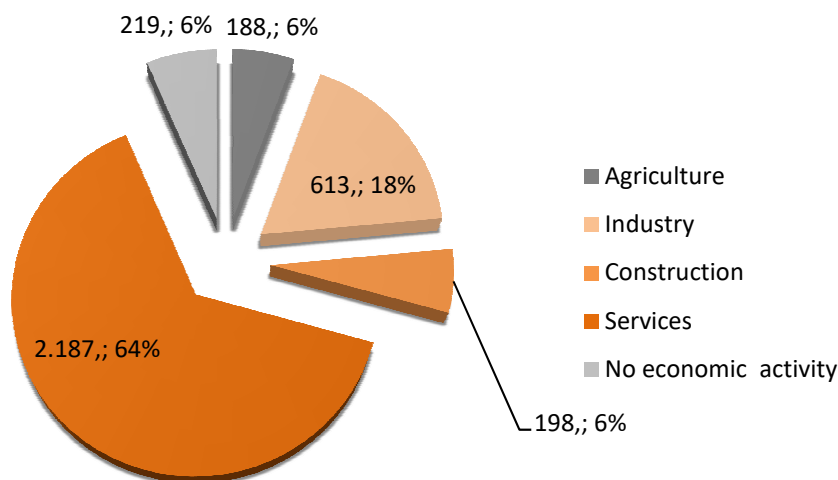

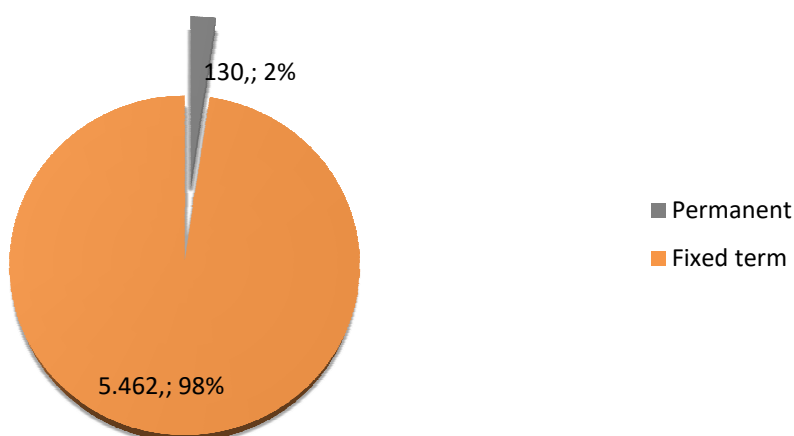

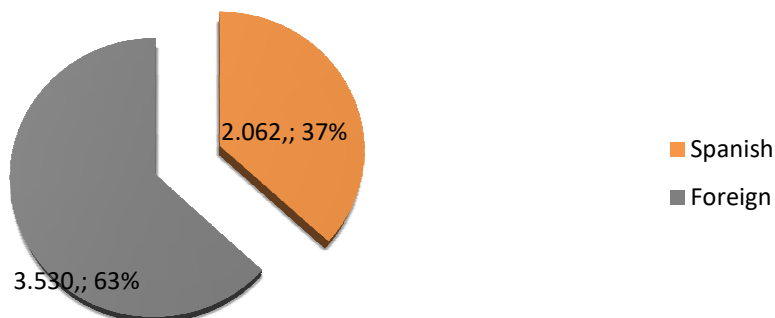
Graph 7. By type of working day



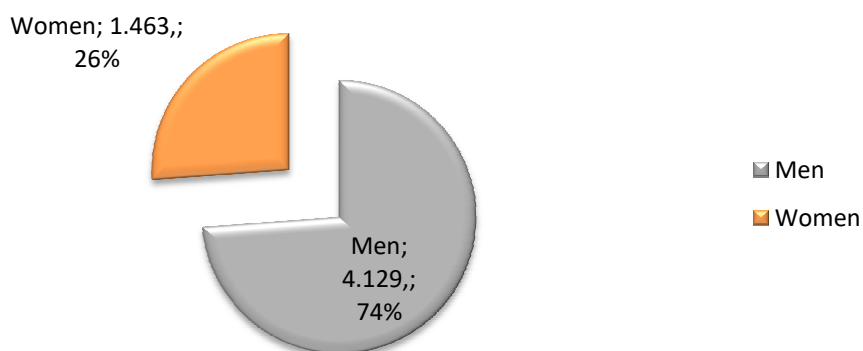

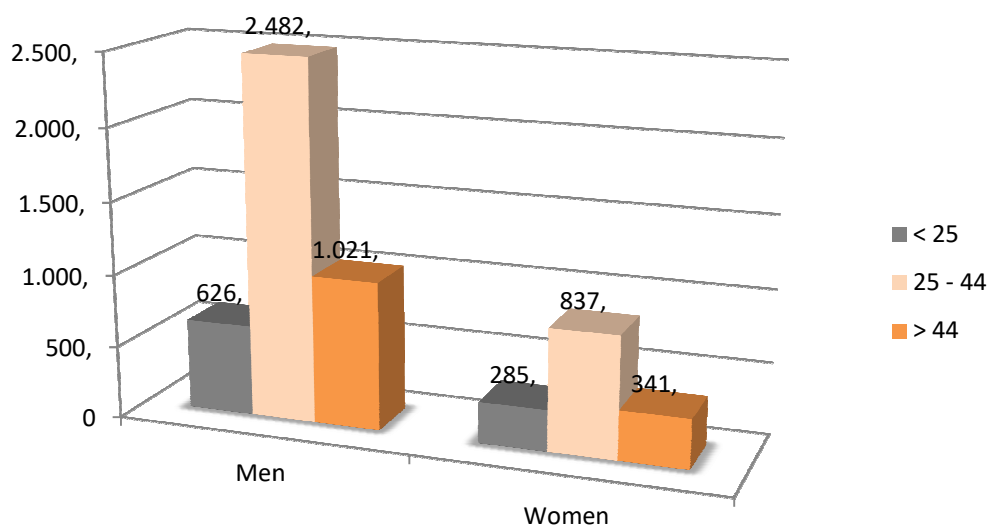

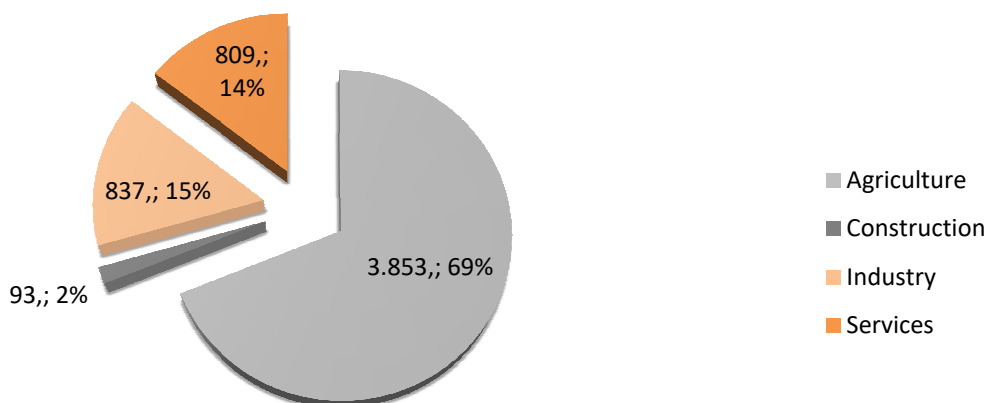

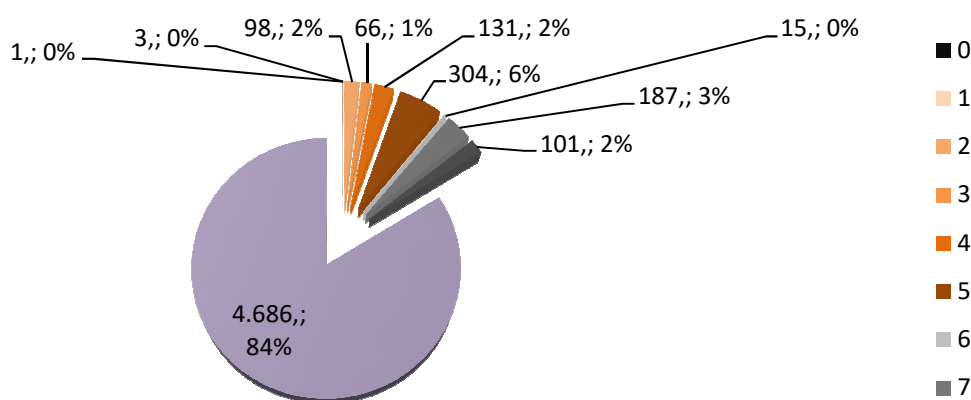

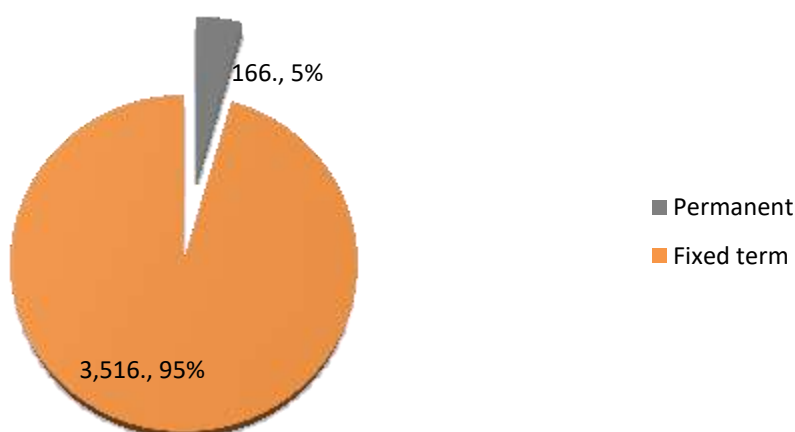

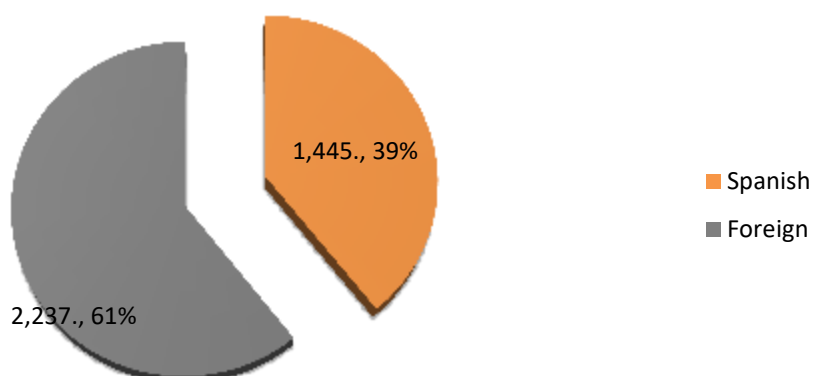
Graph 7. By type of working day



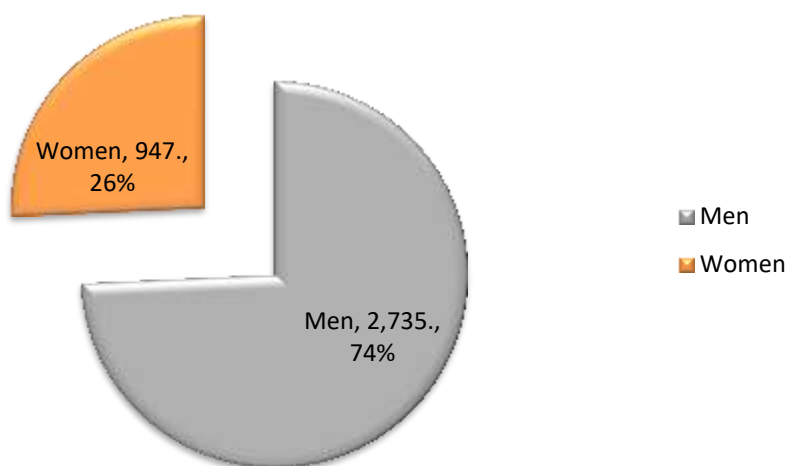

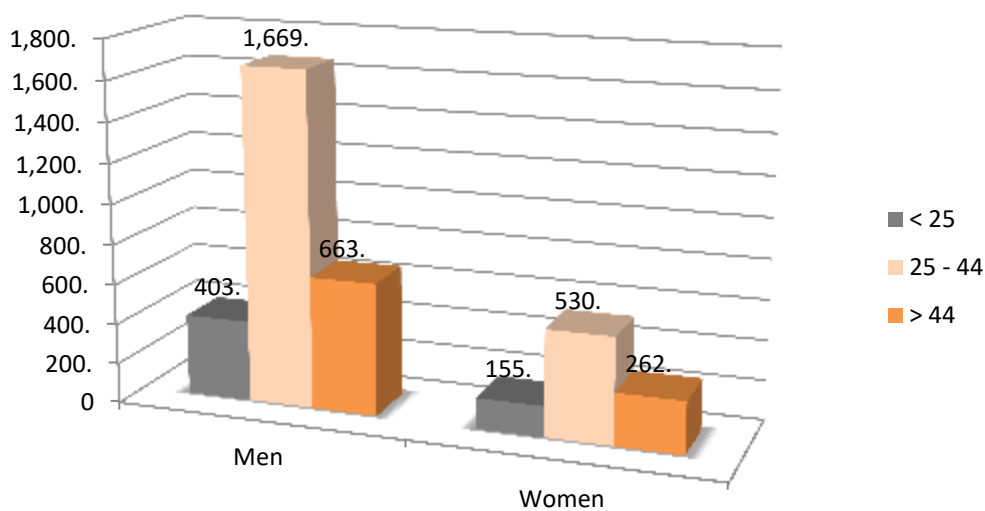

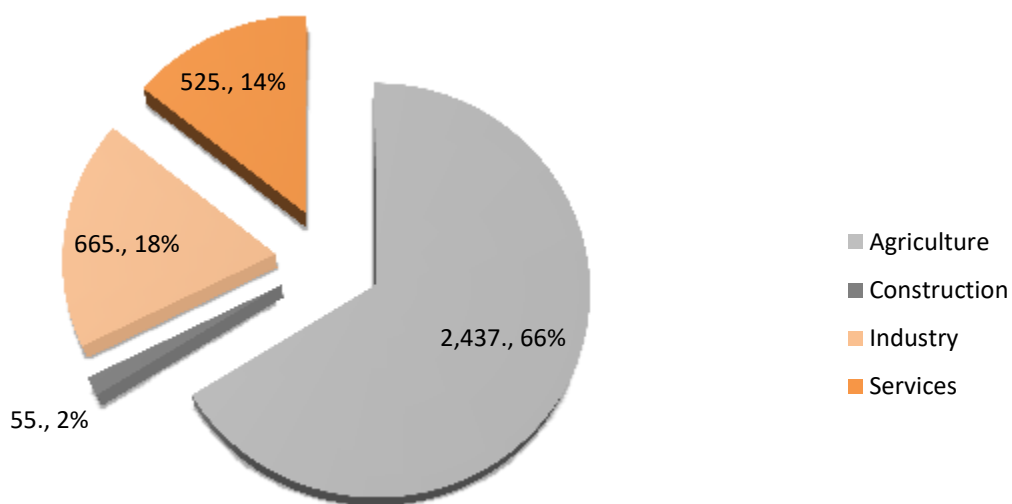

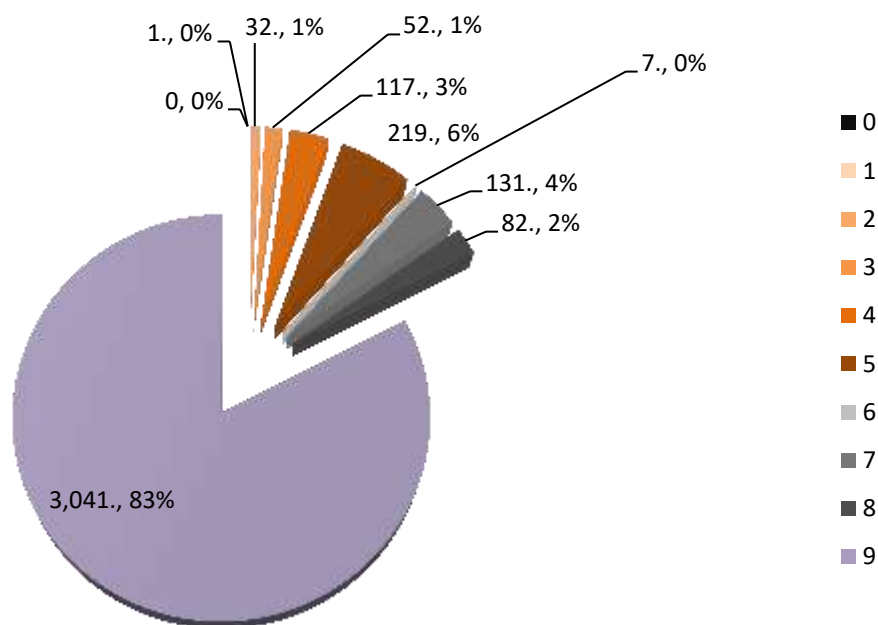

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

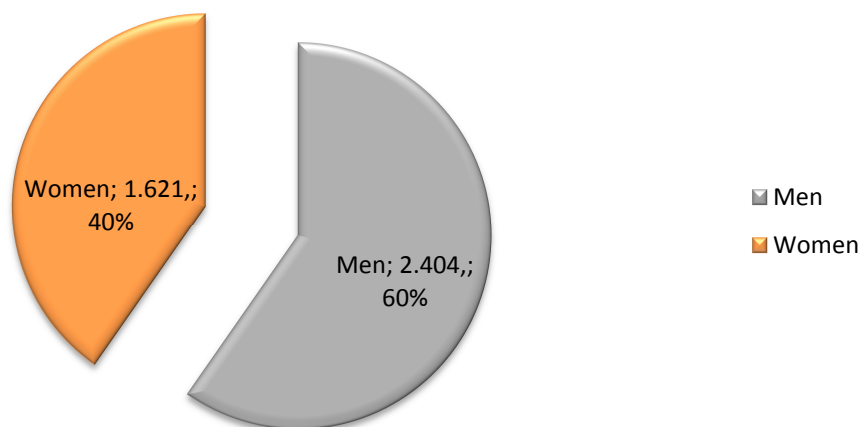
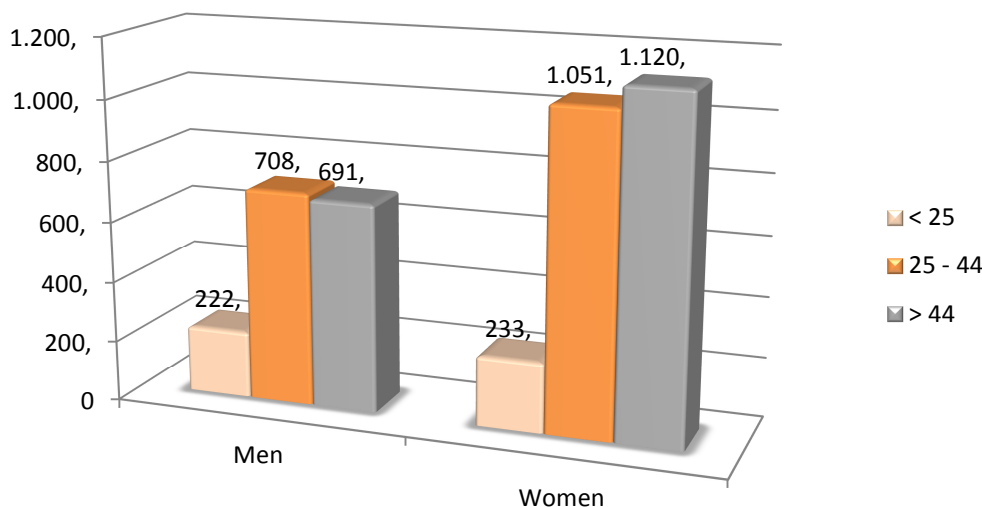
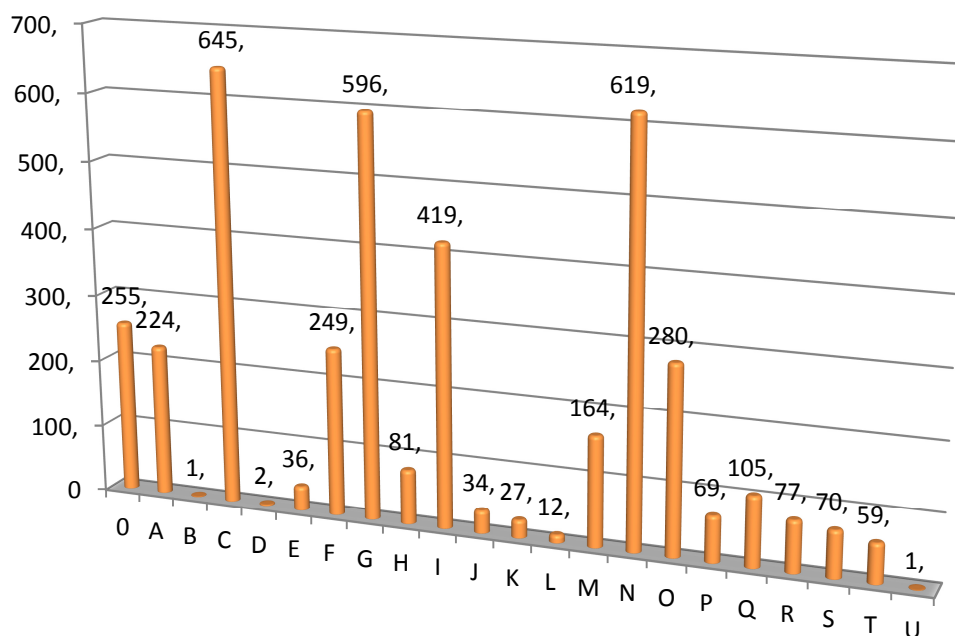


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

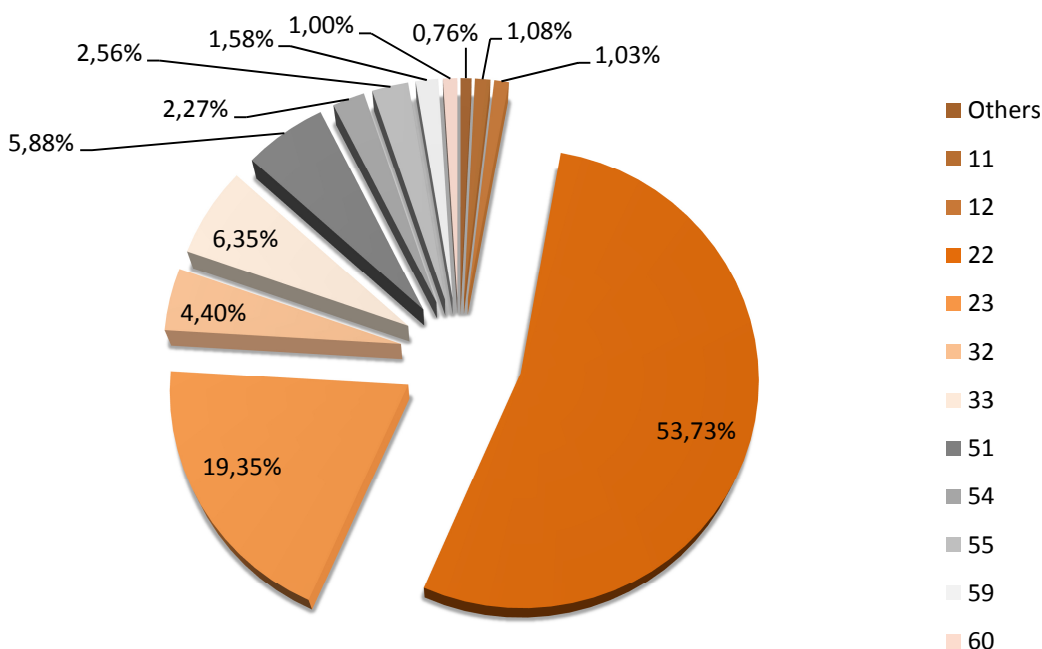


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



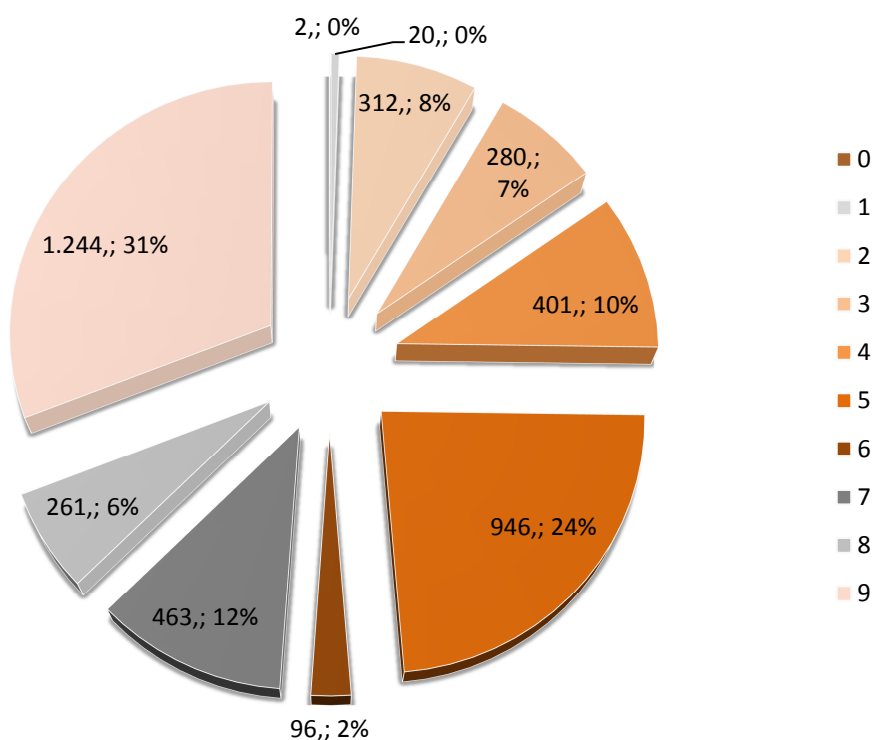

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



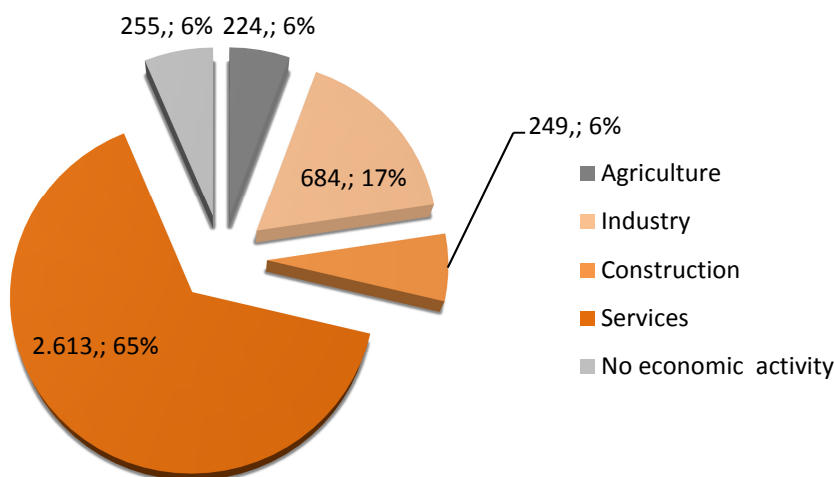

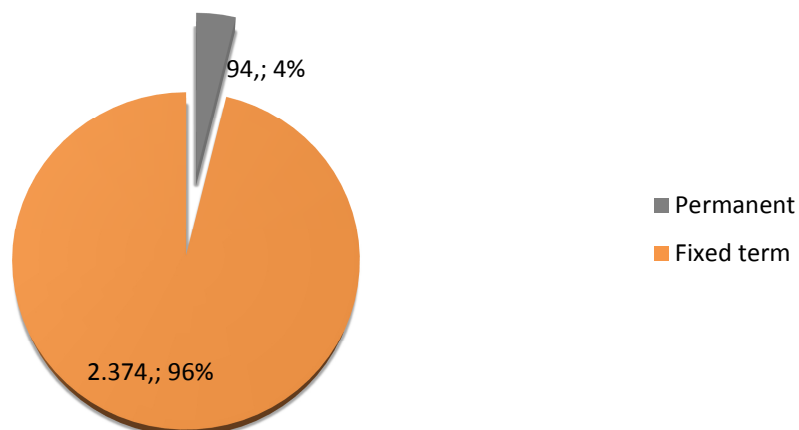

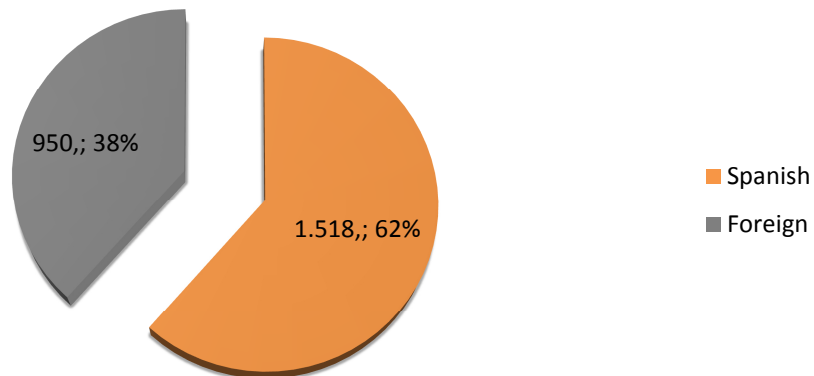

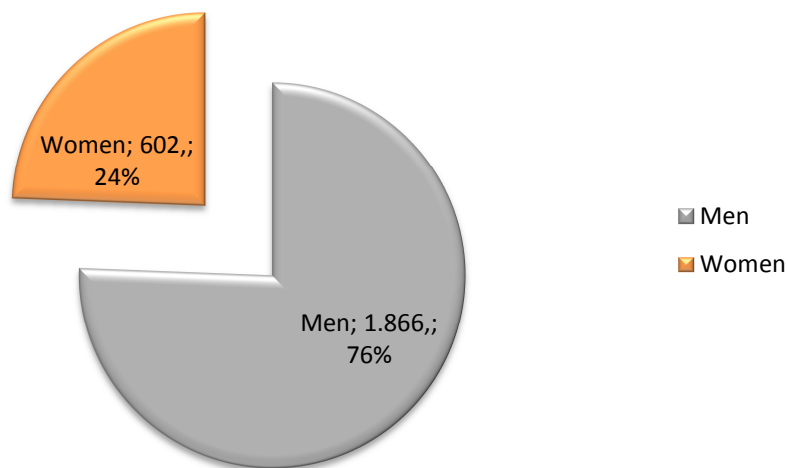

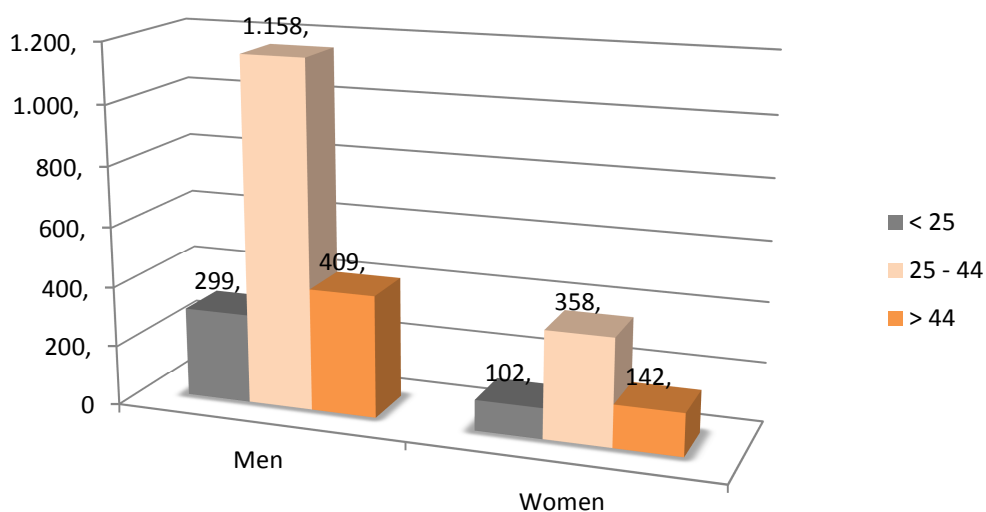

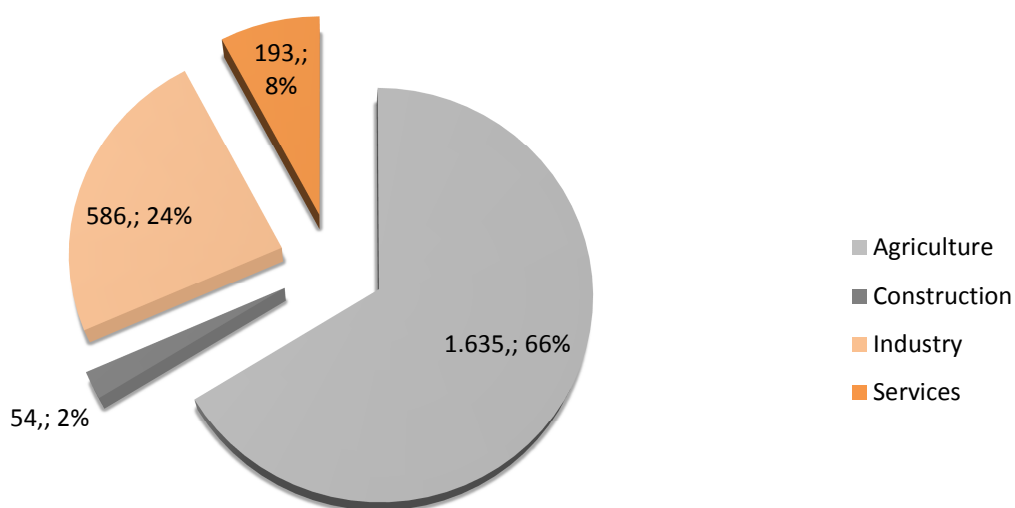

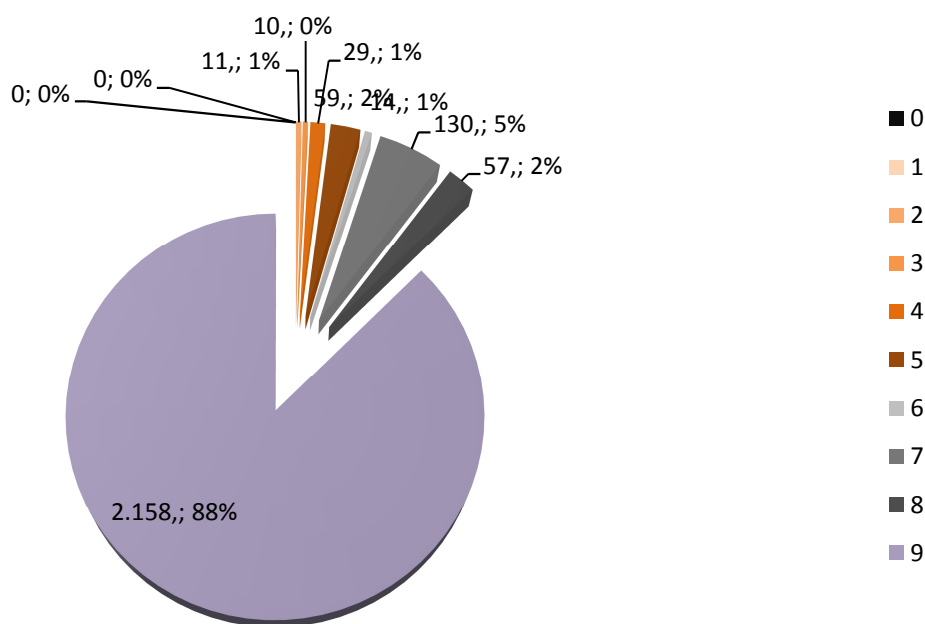

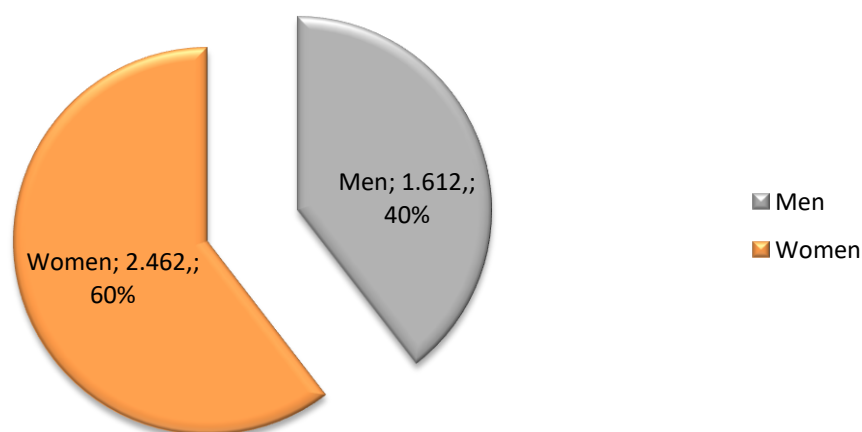
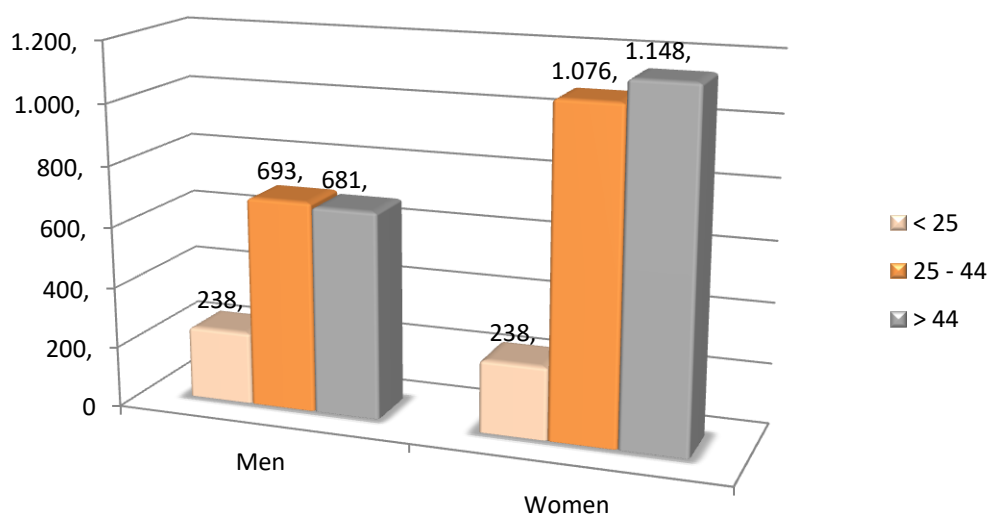
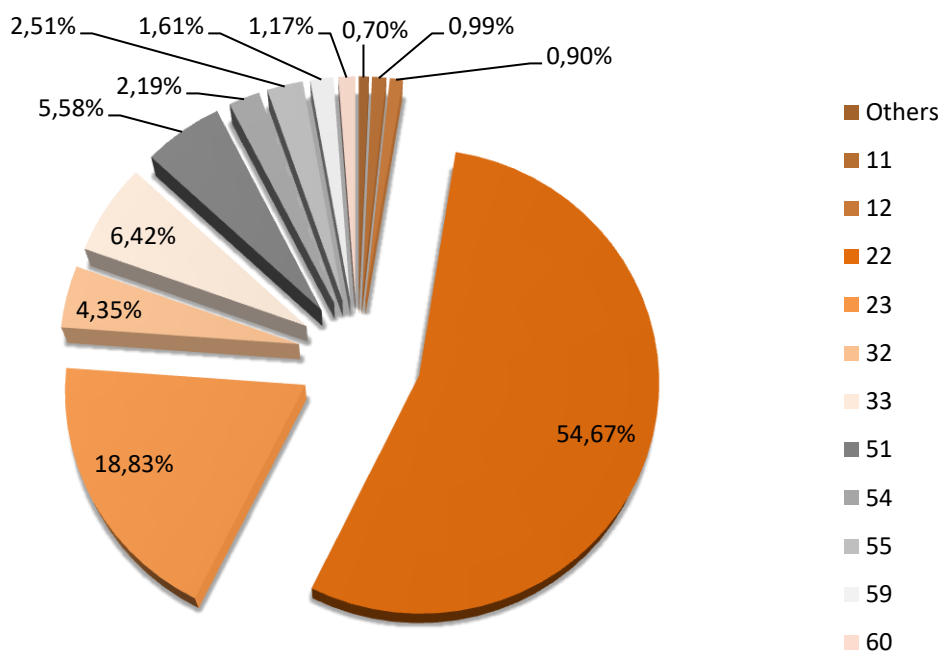


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

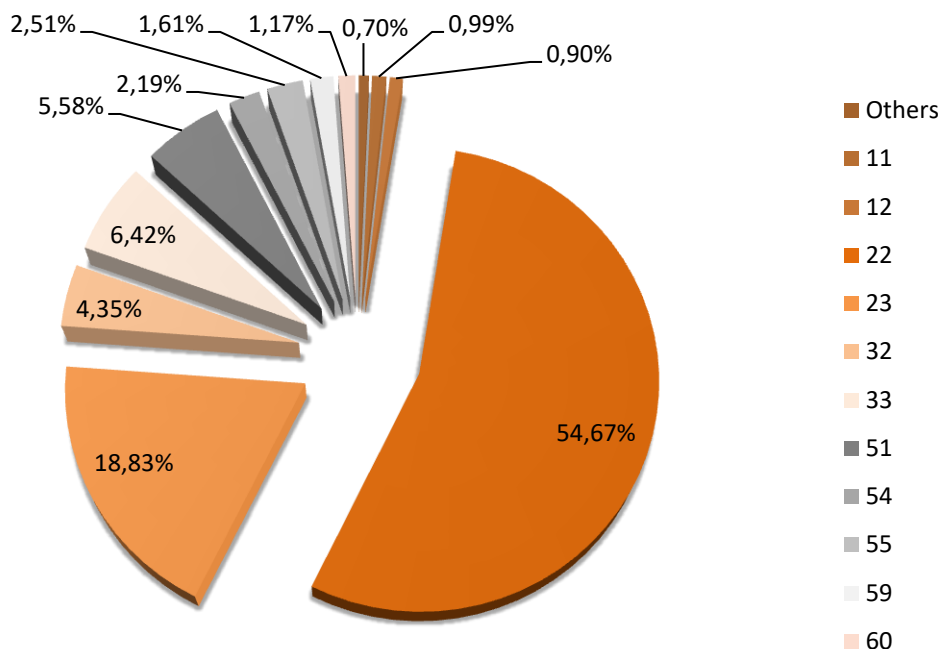


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



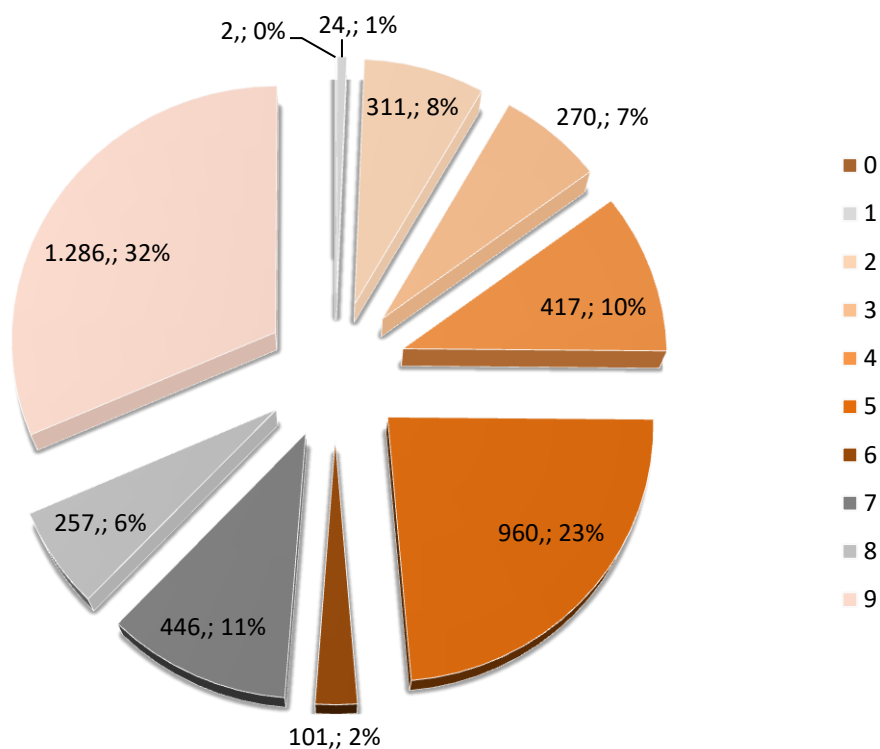

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



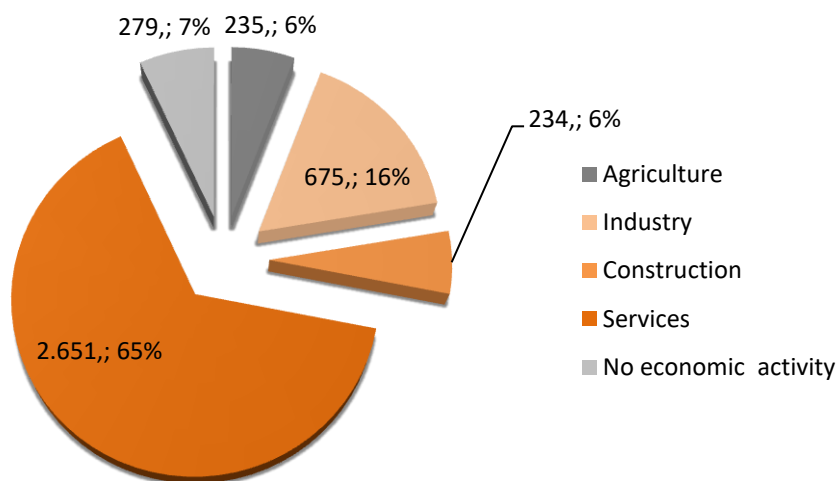

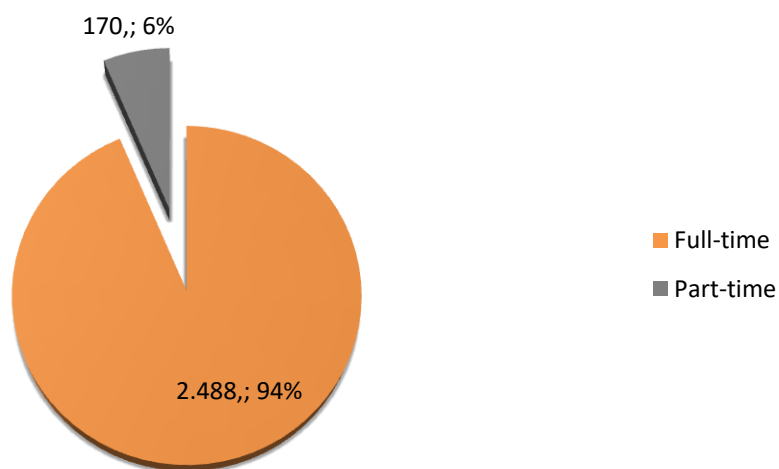

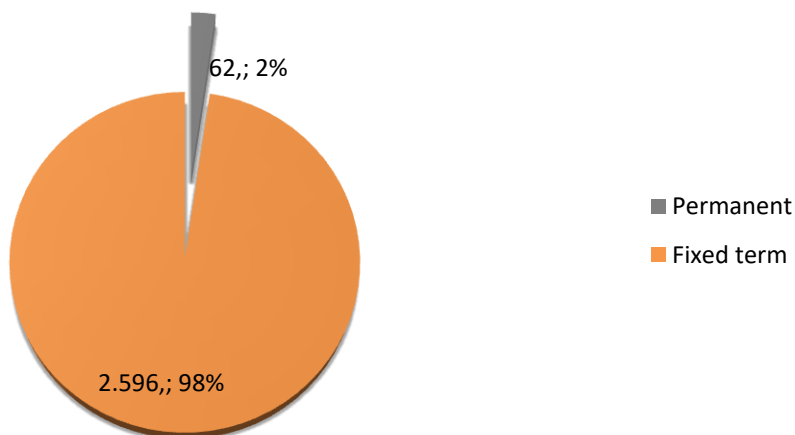

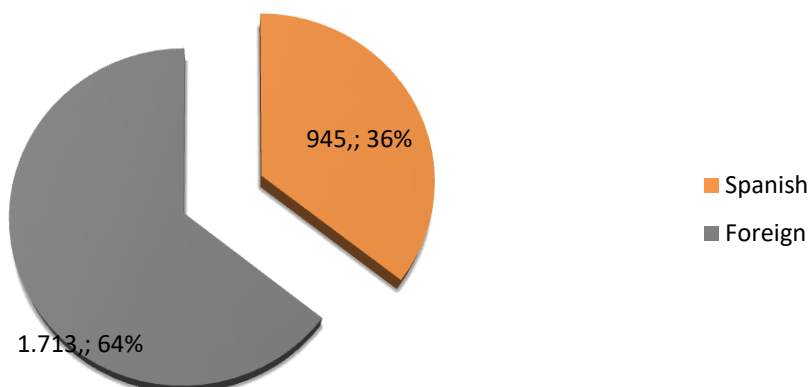
Graph 7. By type of working day



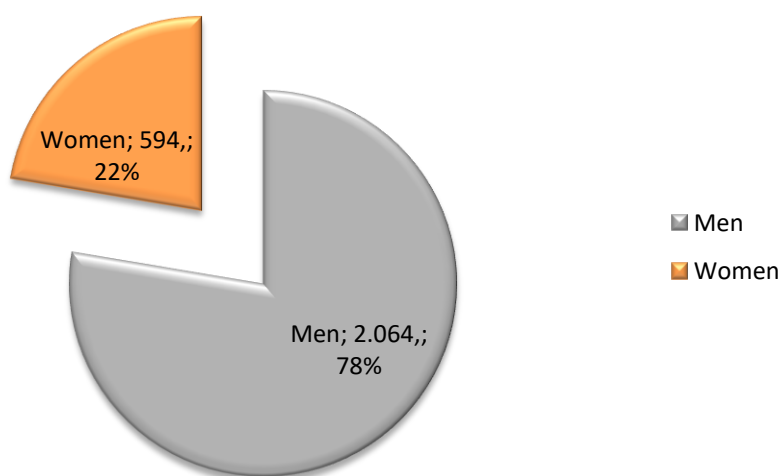

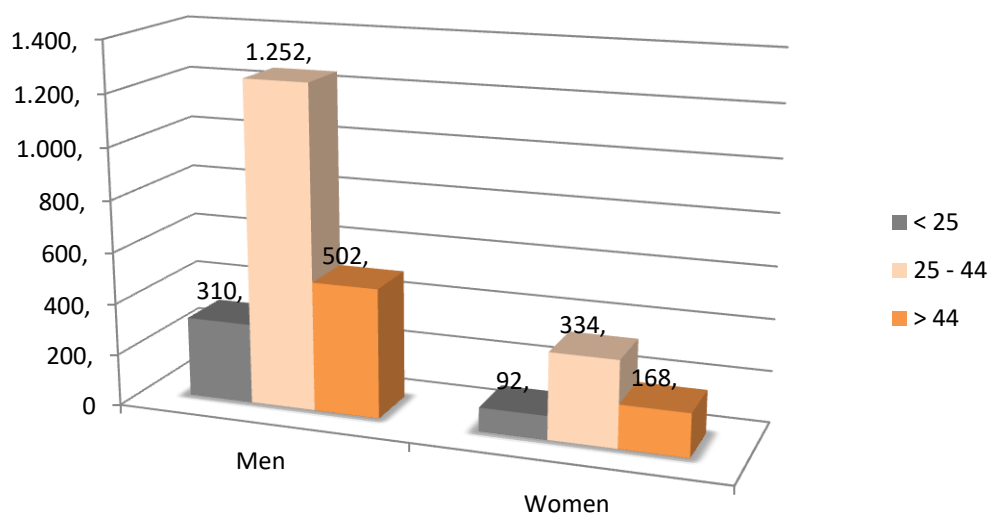

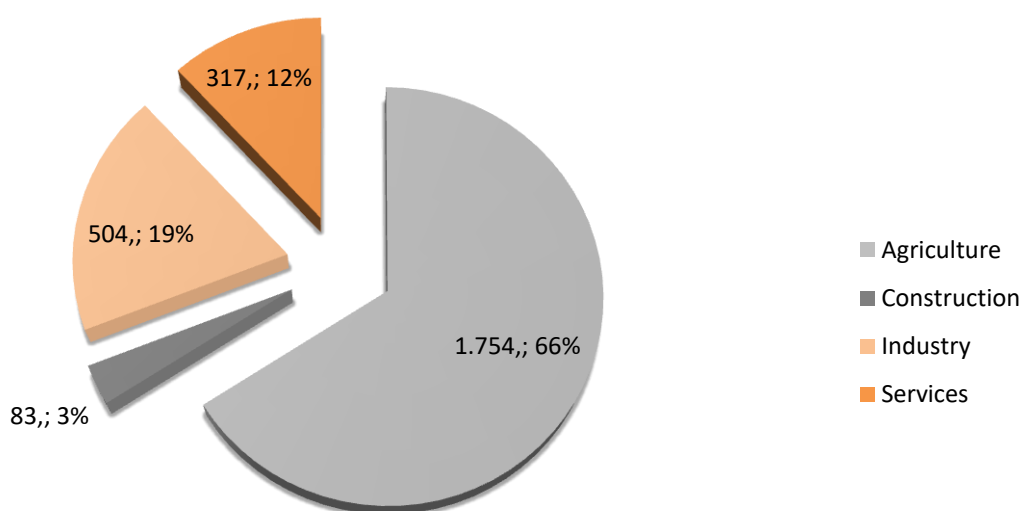

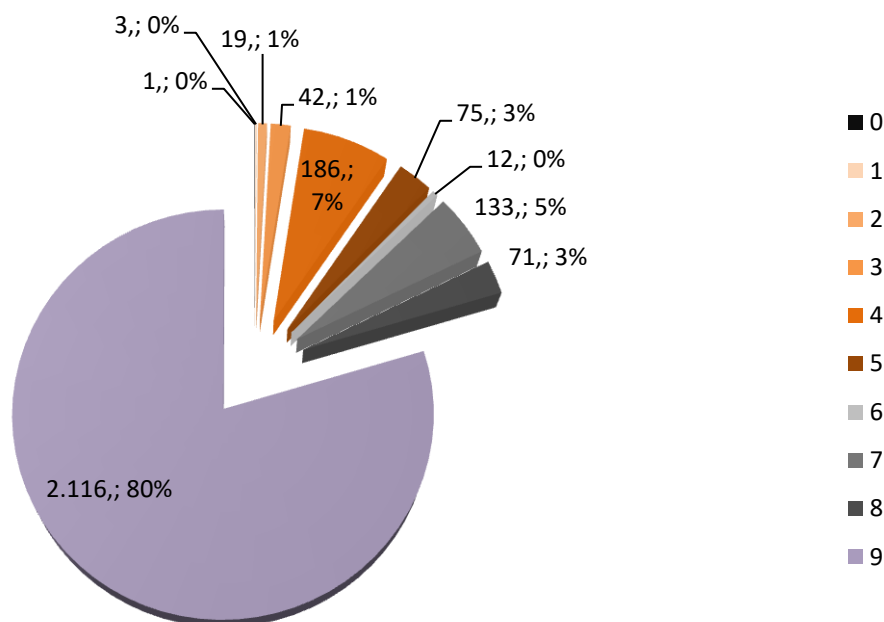

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

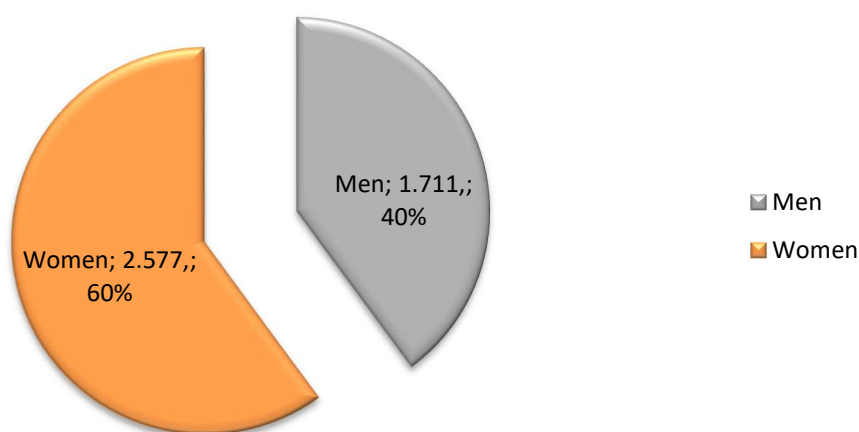
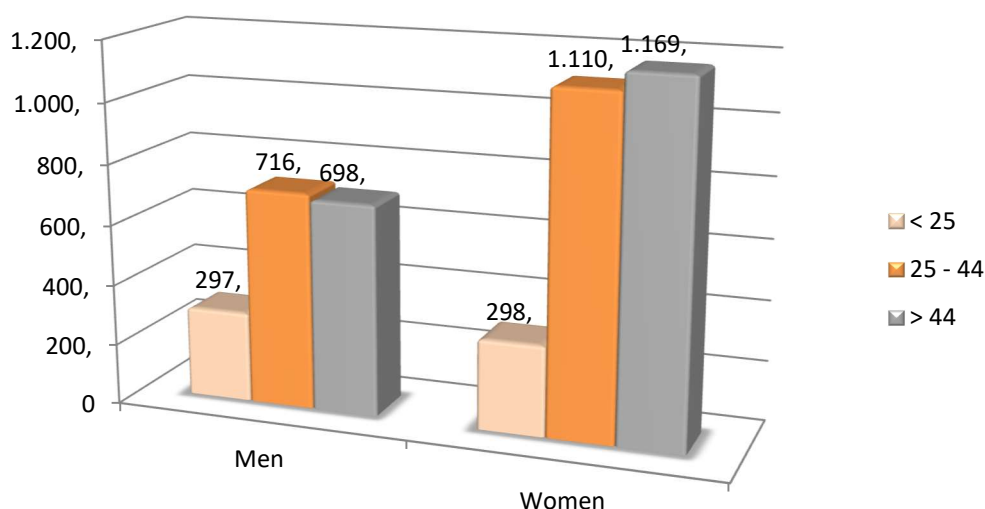
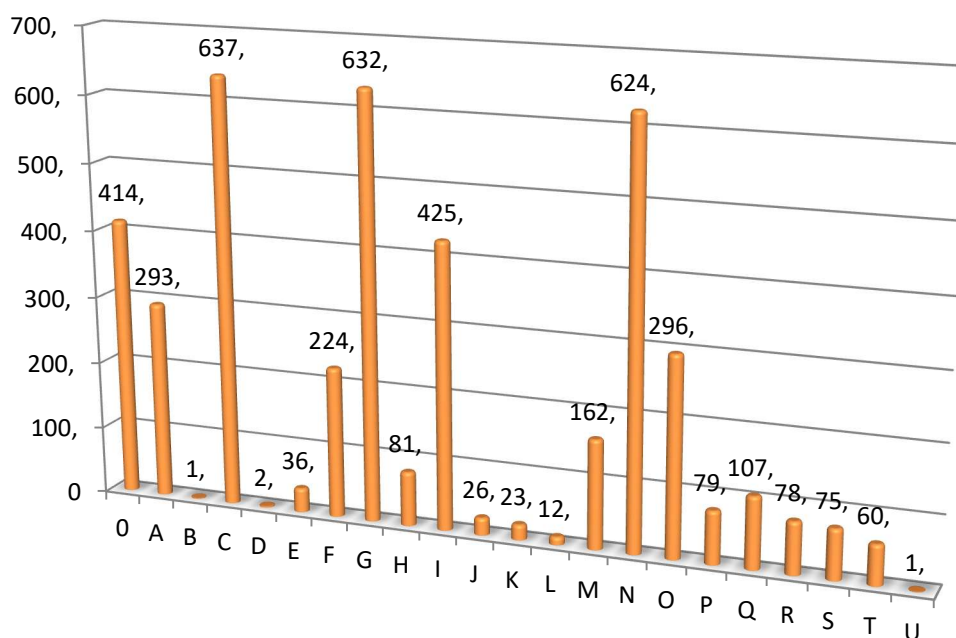


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

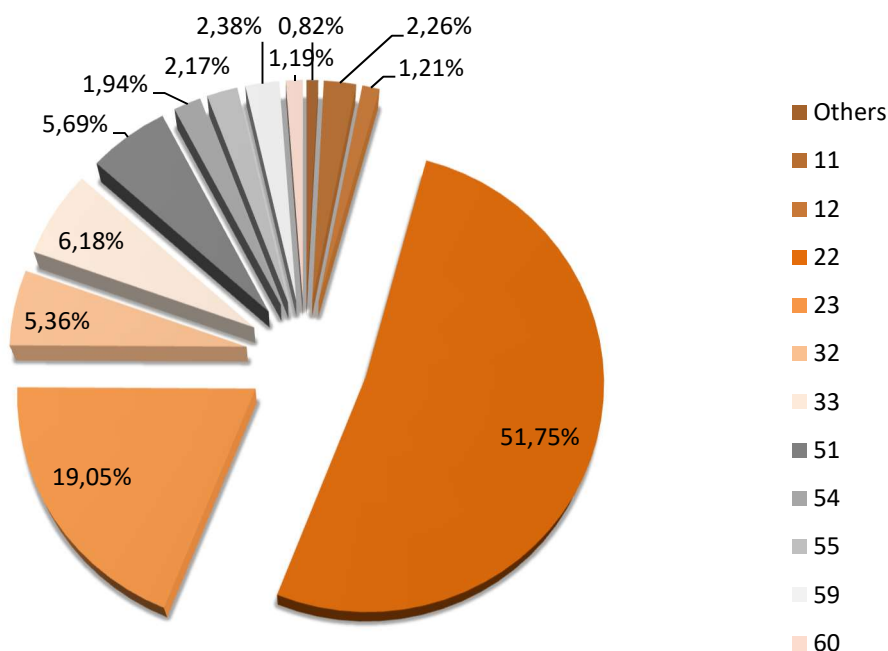


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



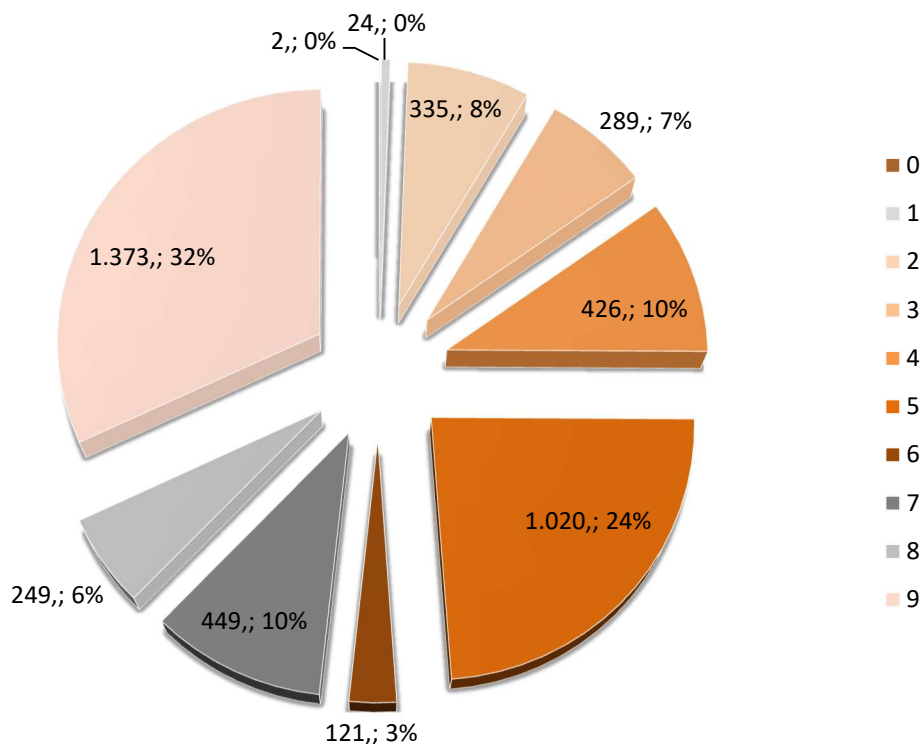

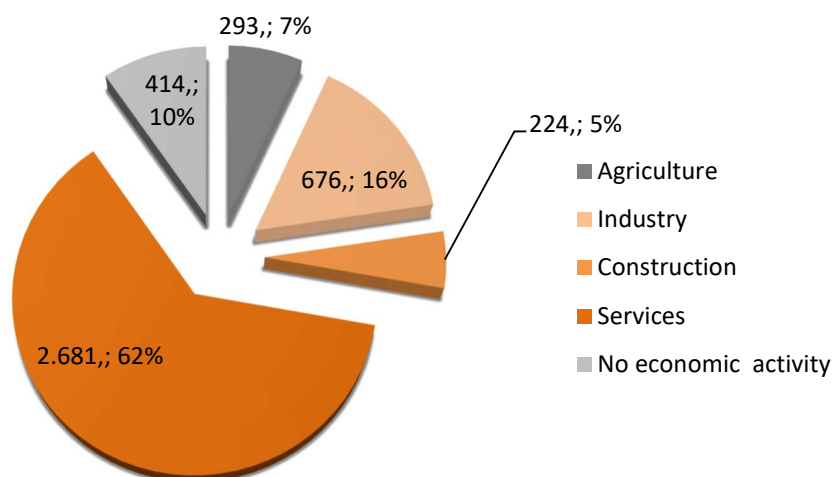

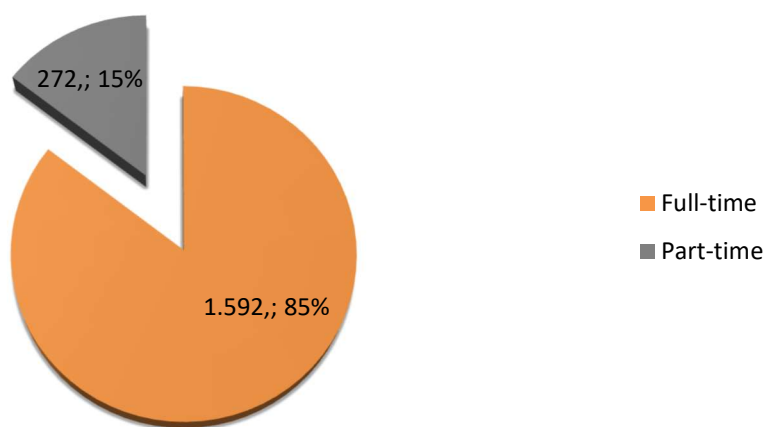

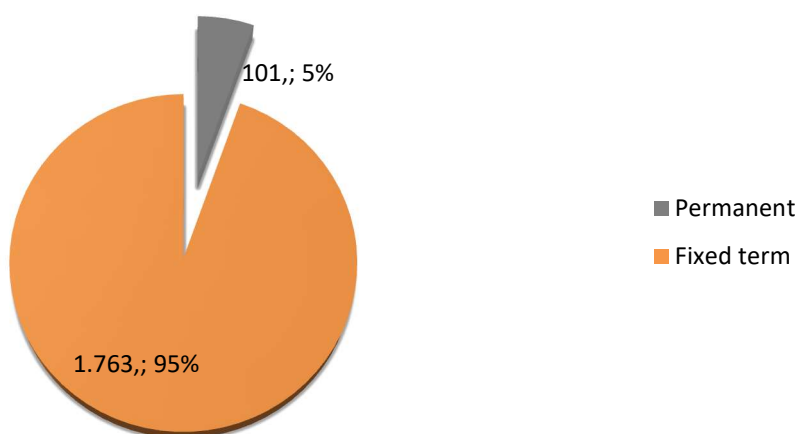

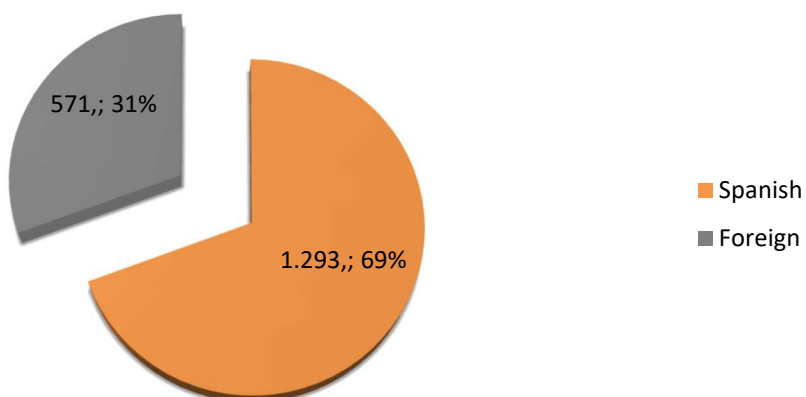

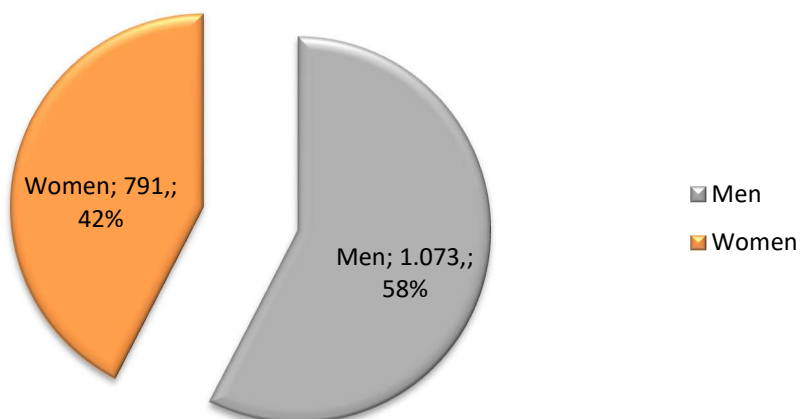

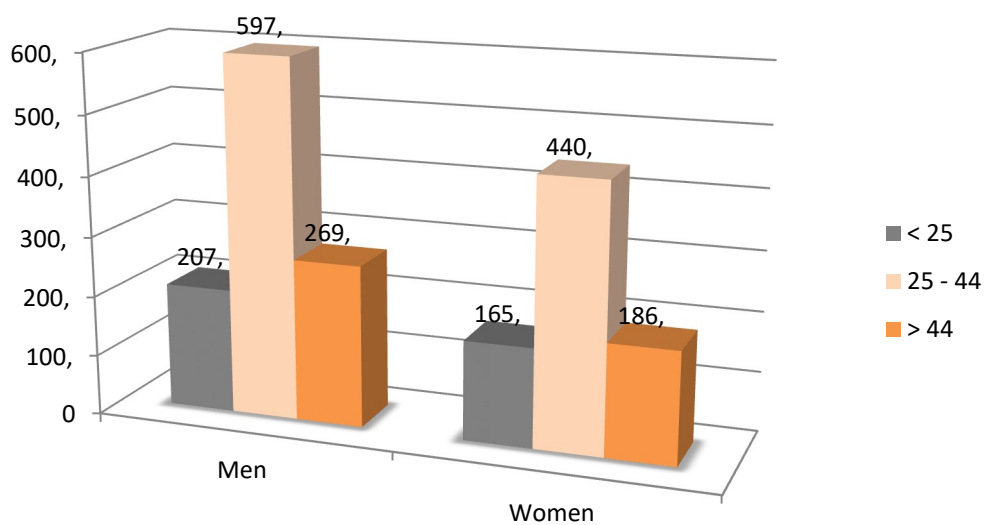

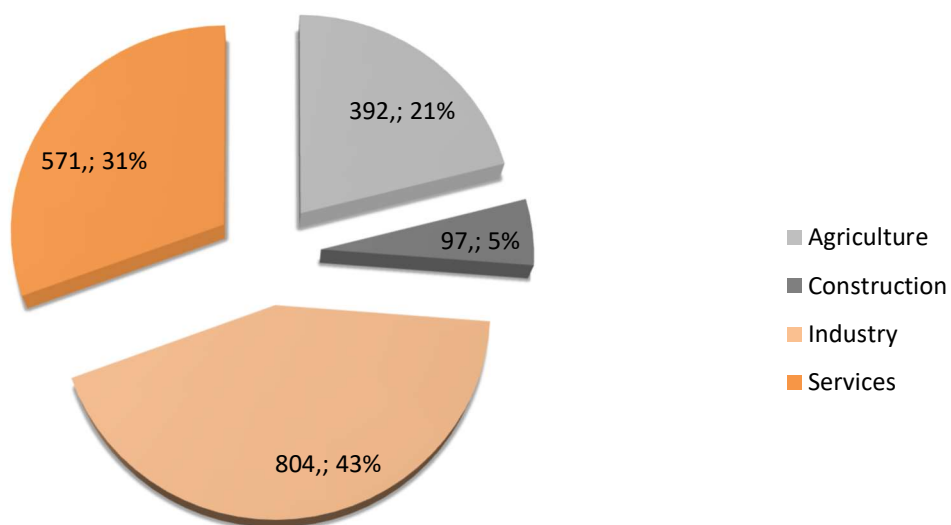

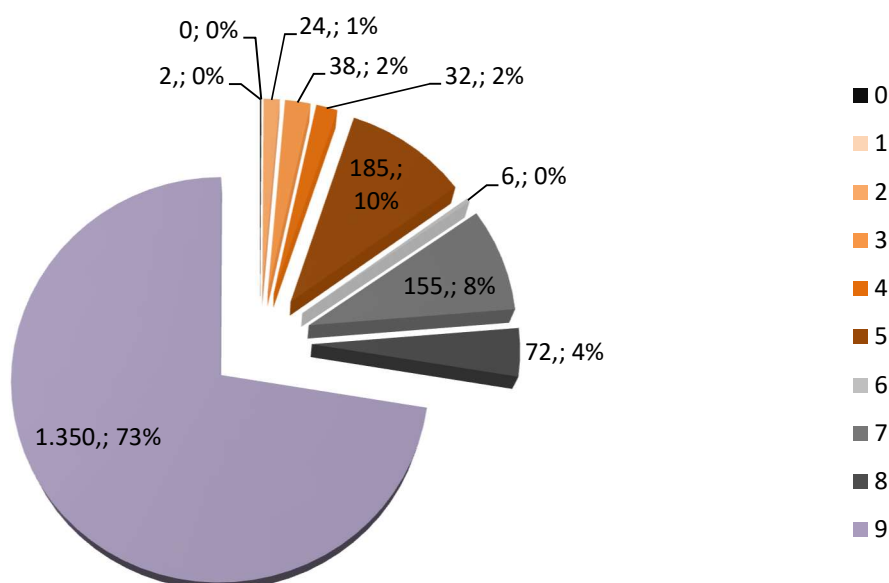

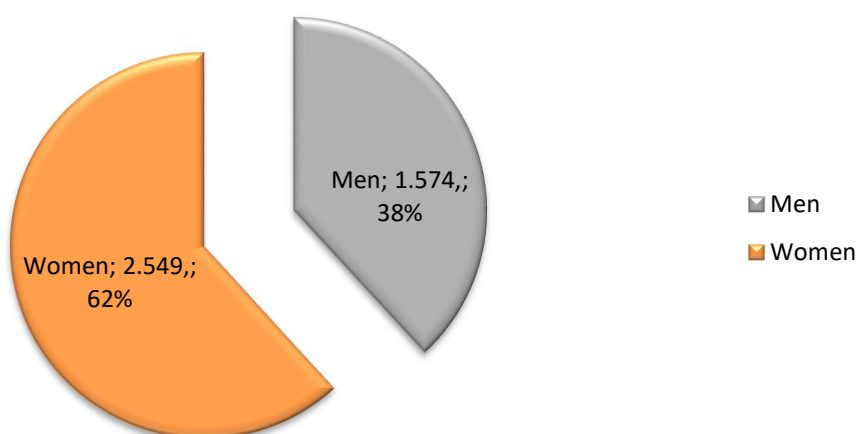
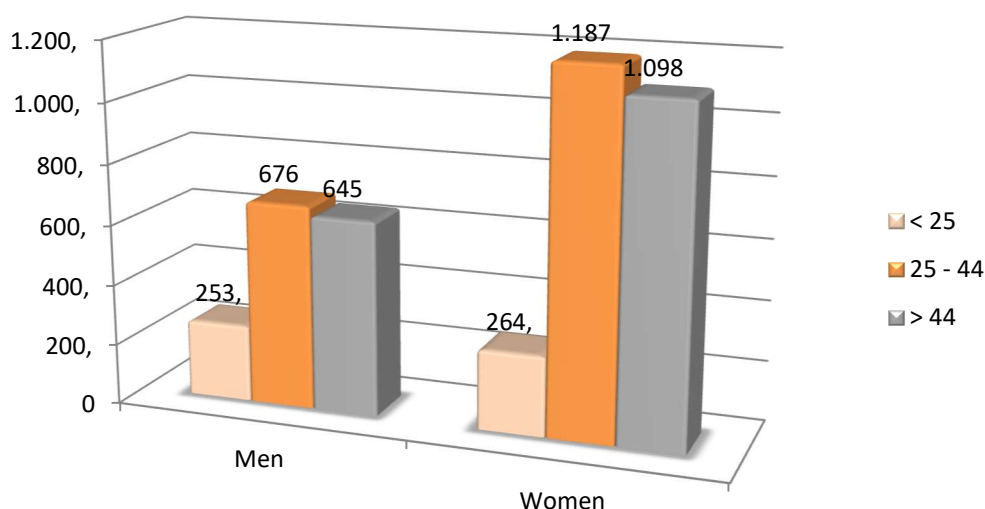
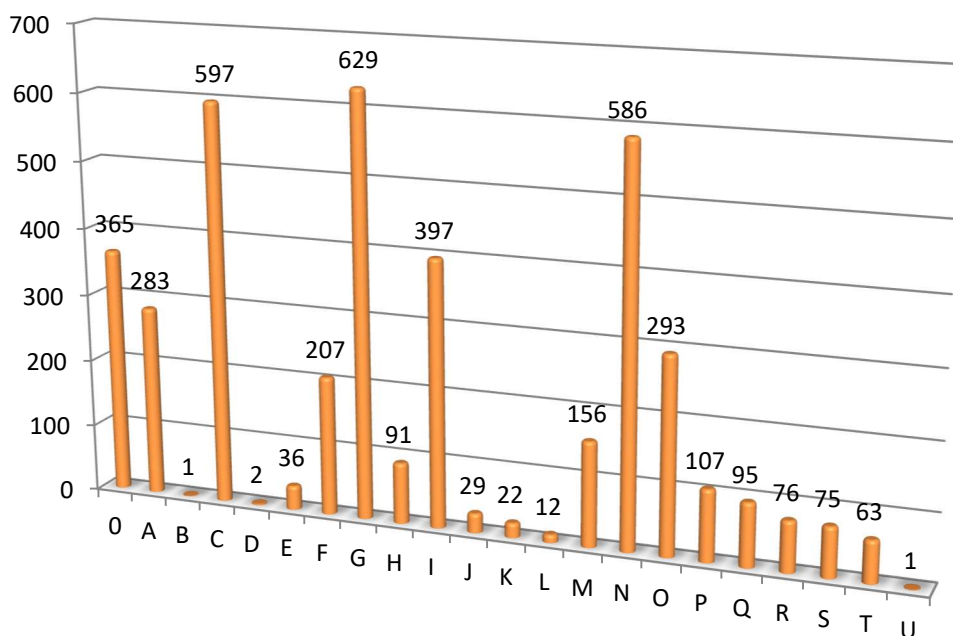


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

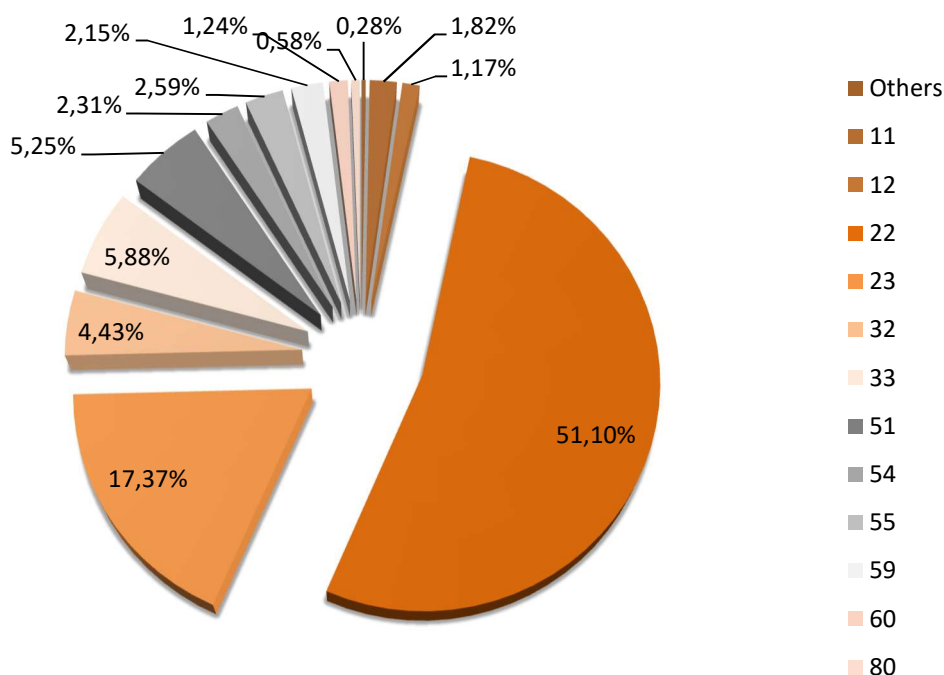


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



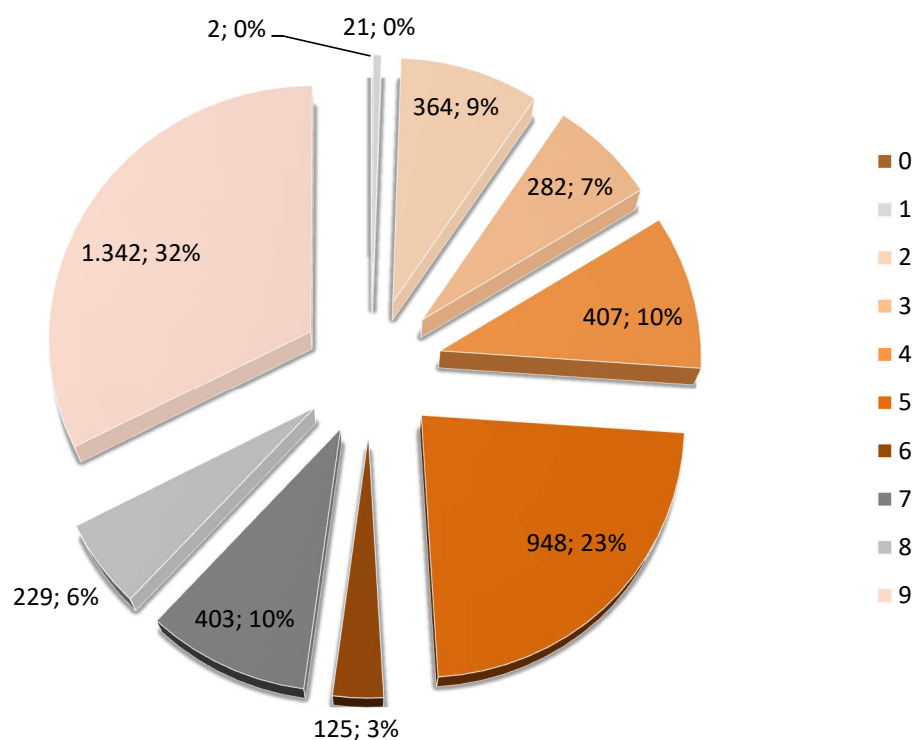

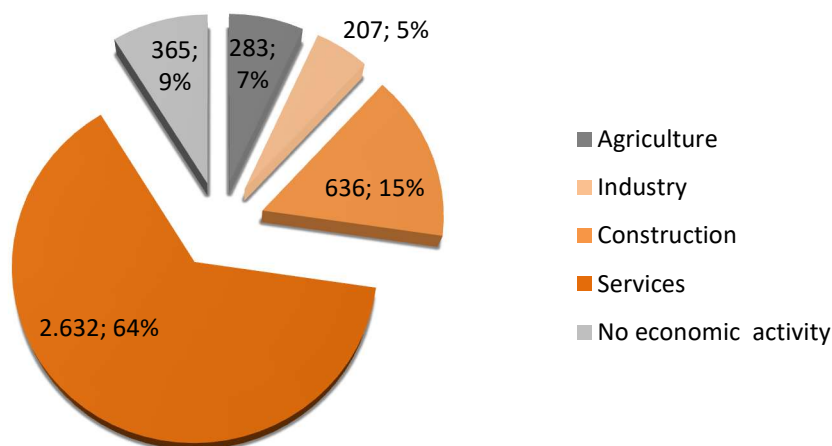

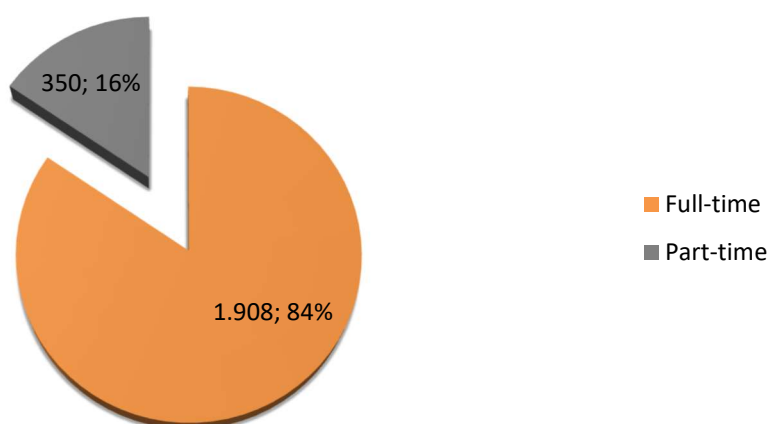

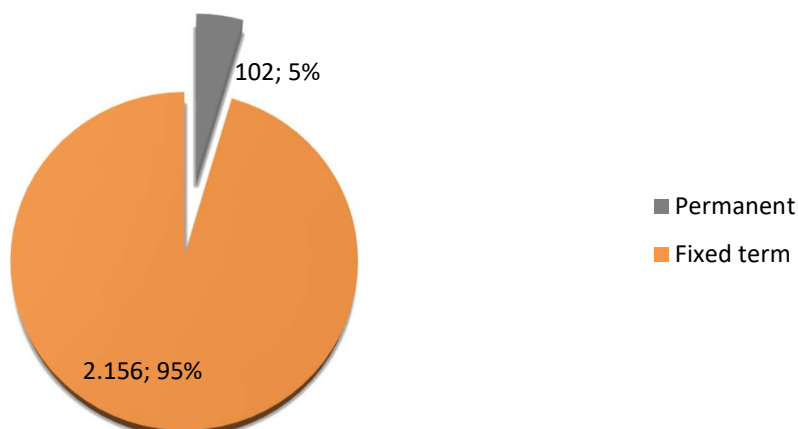

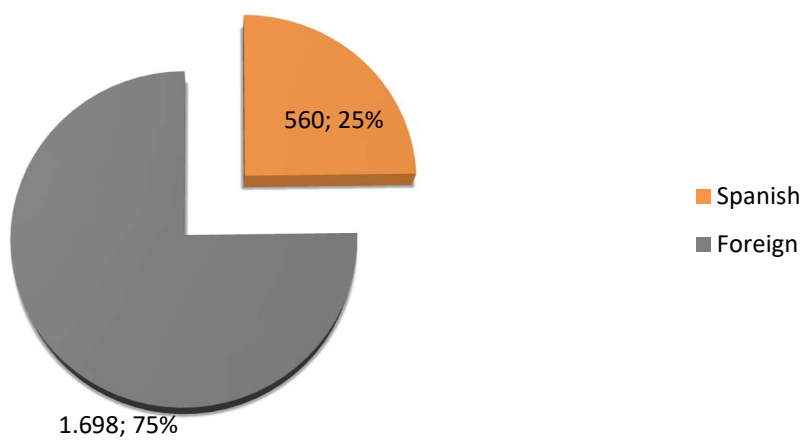

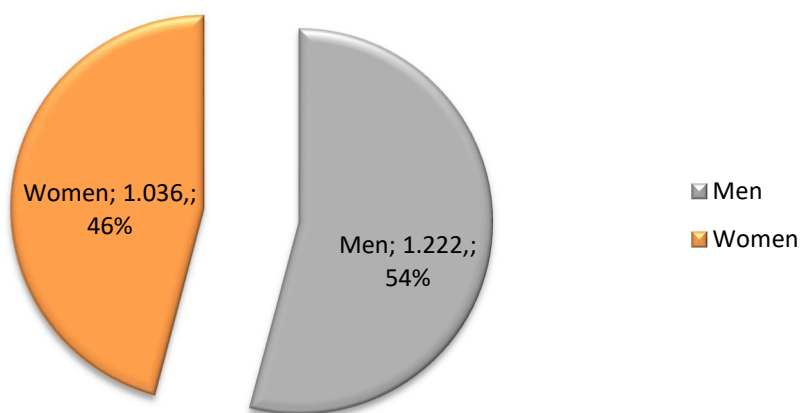

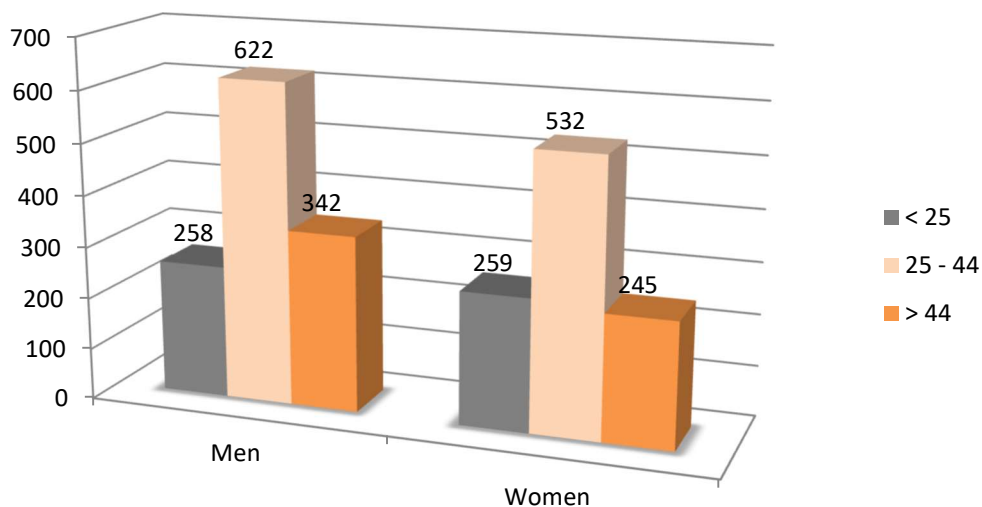

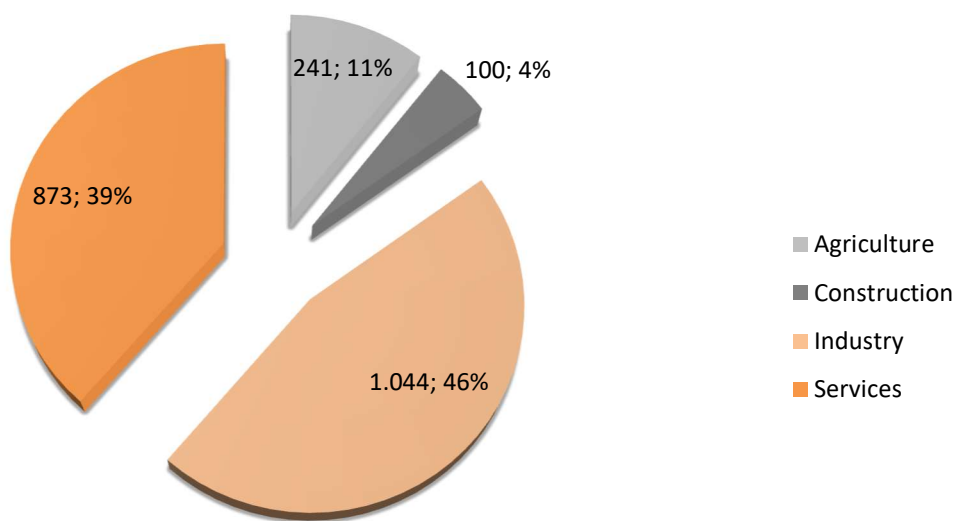

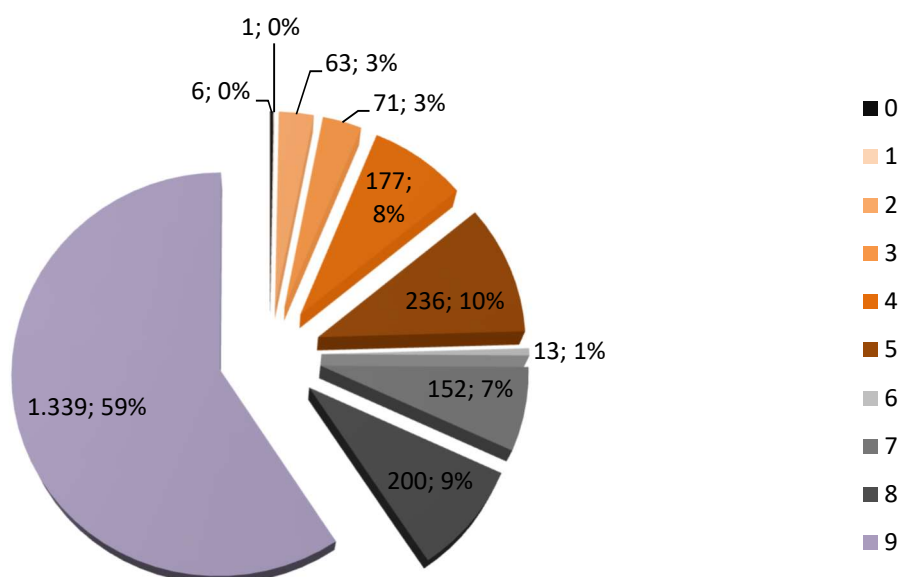

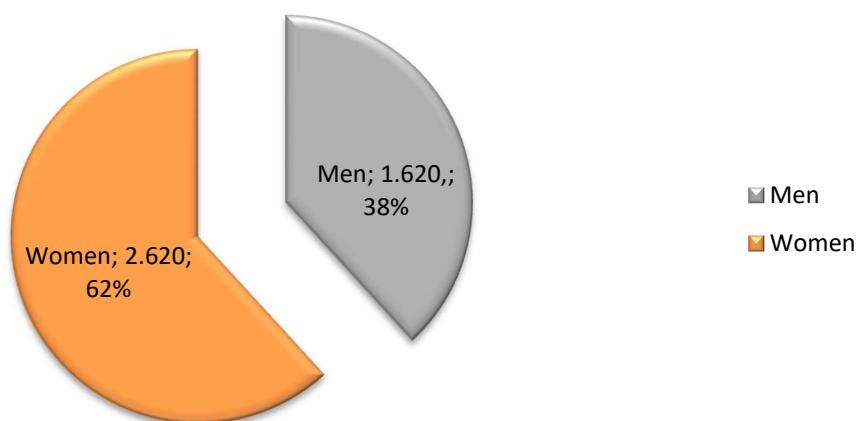
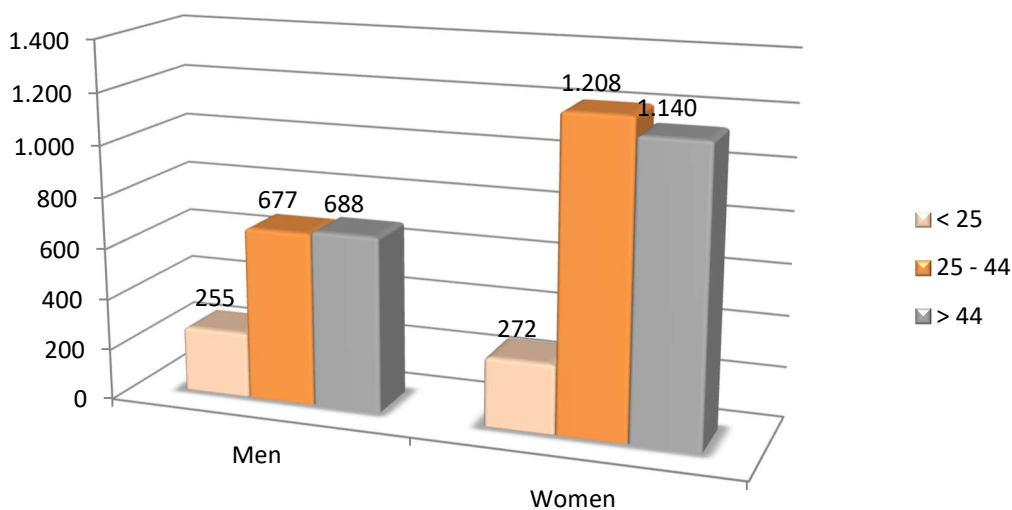
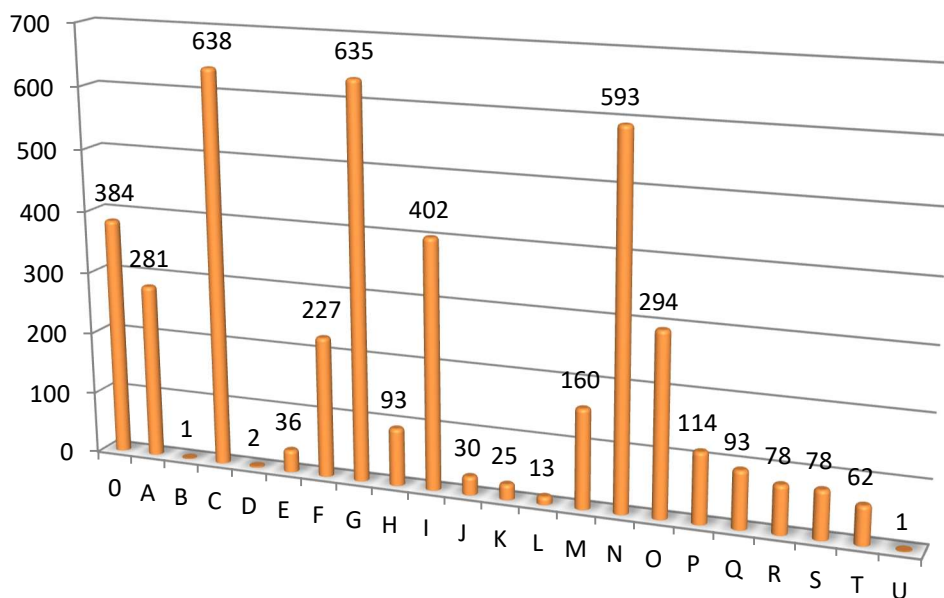


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

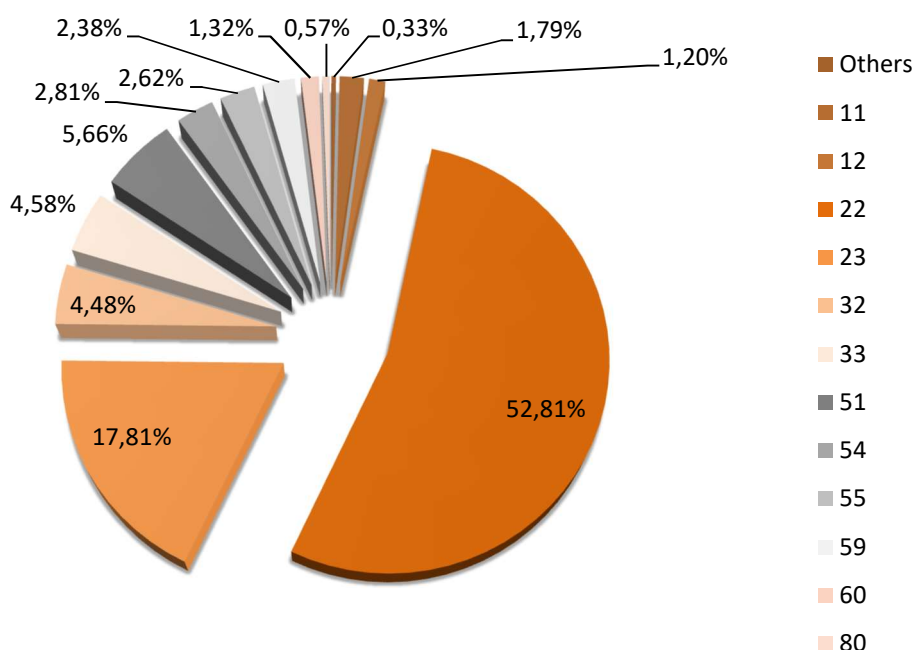


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



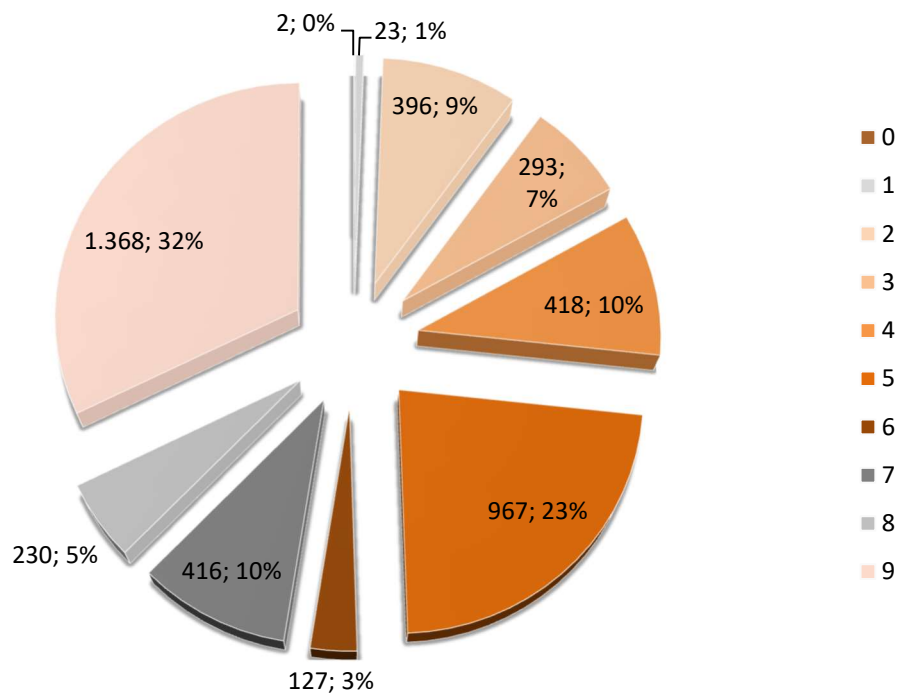

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



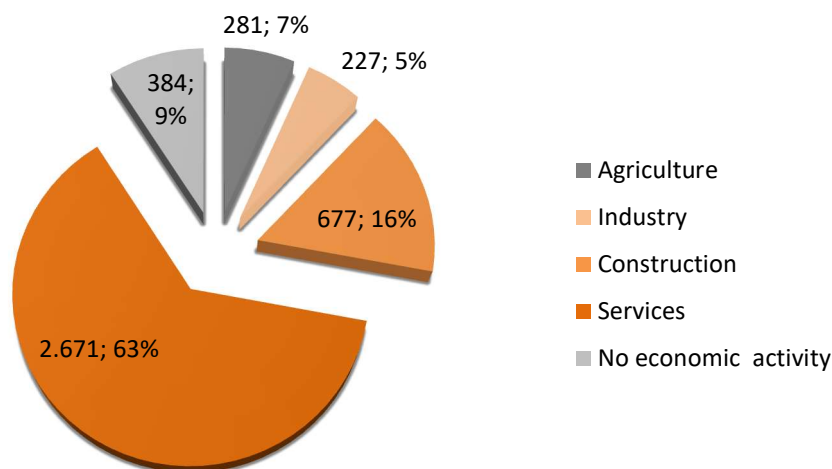

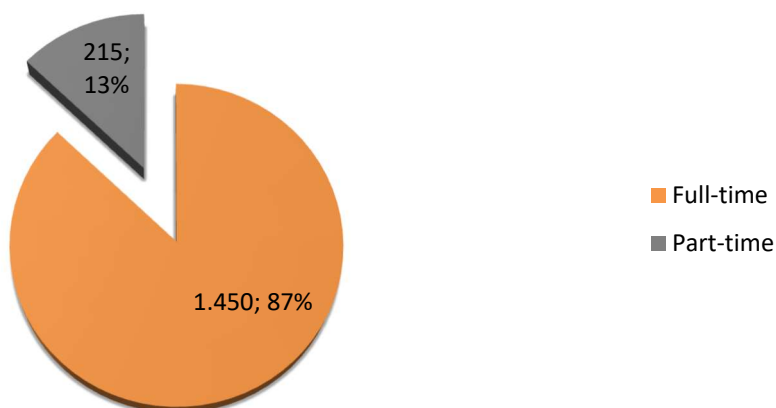

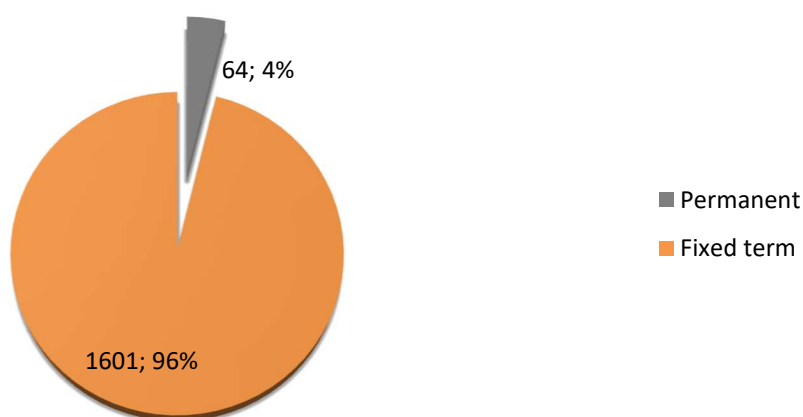

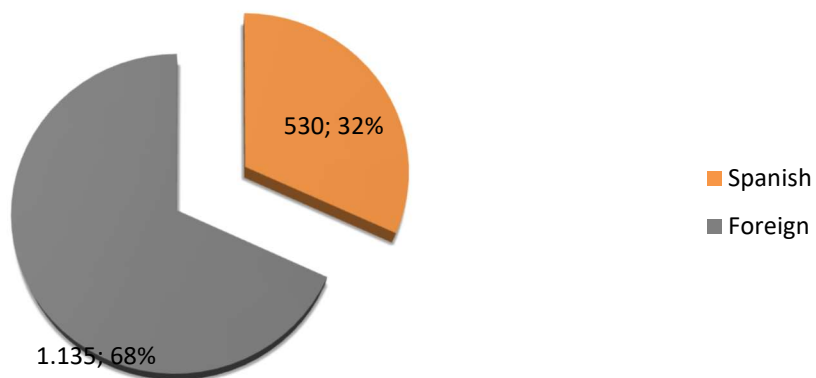
Graph 7. By type of working day



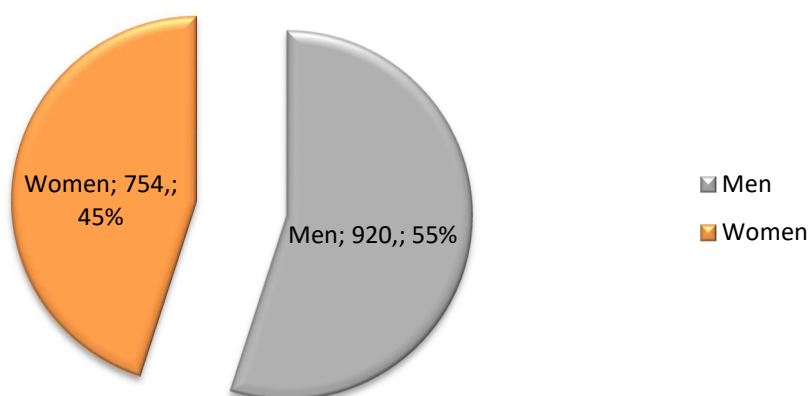

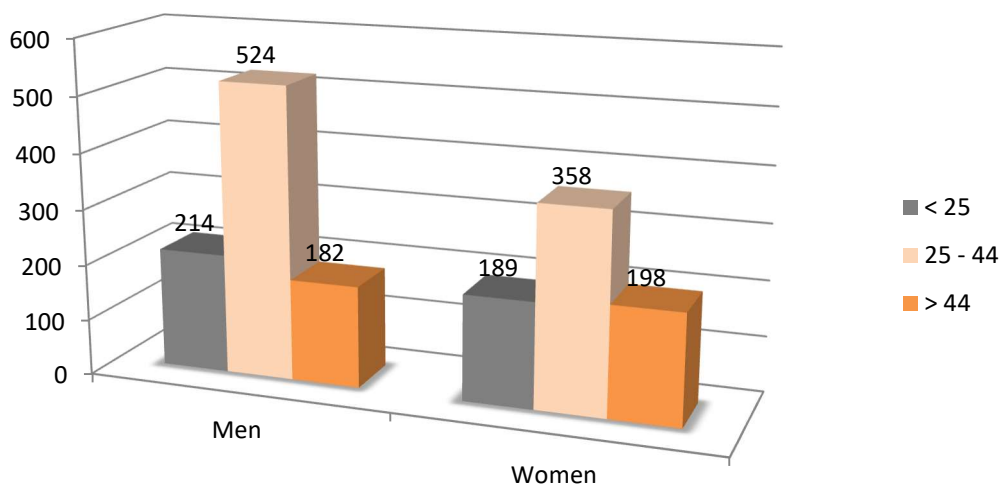

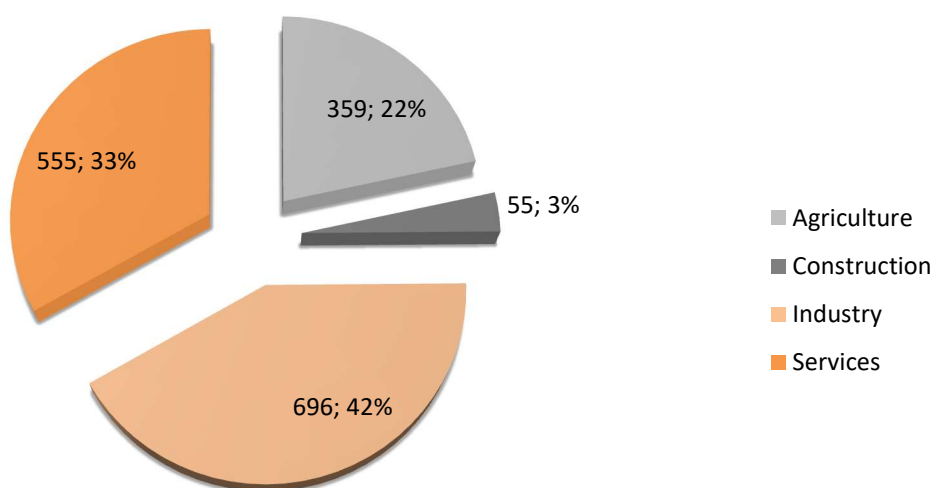

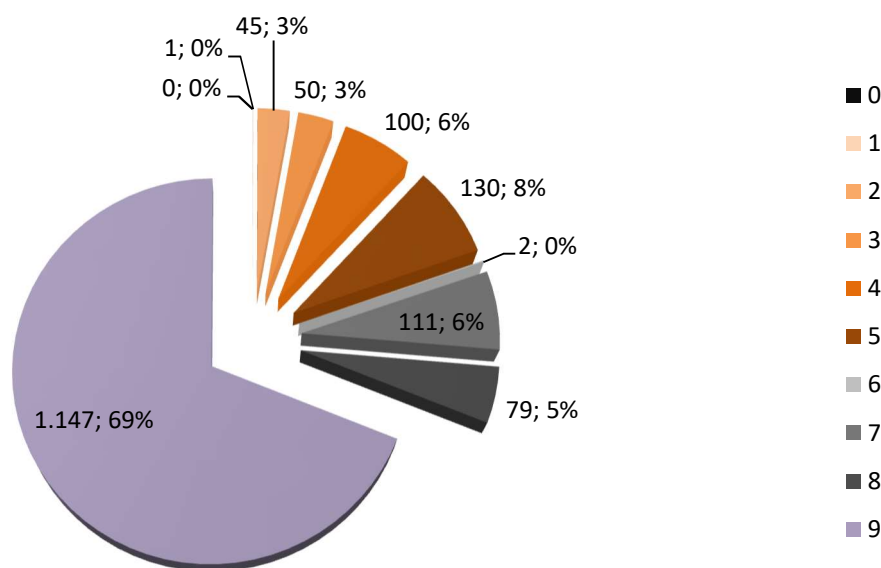

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

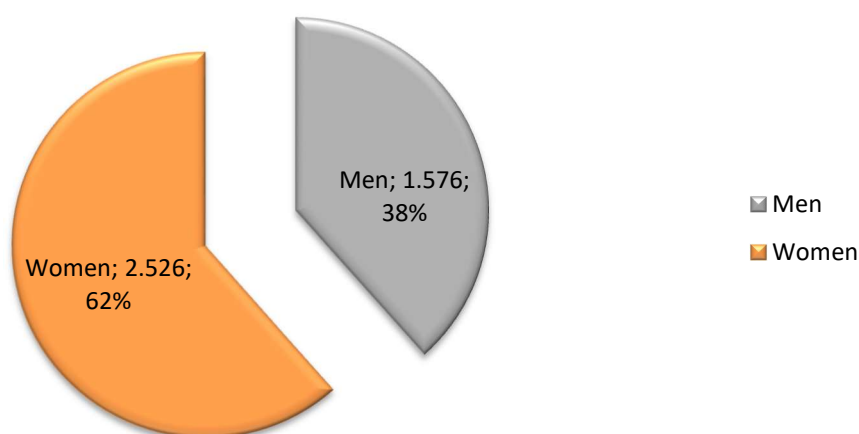
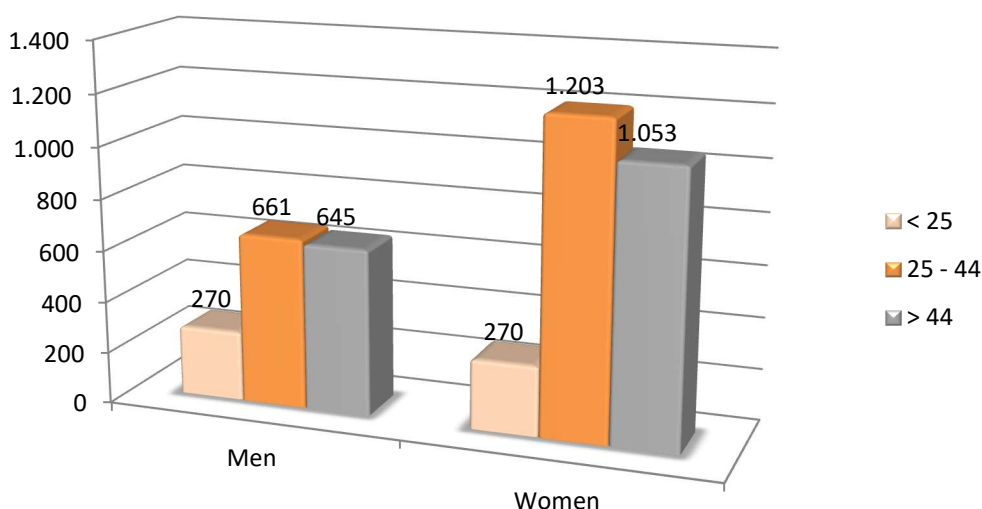
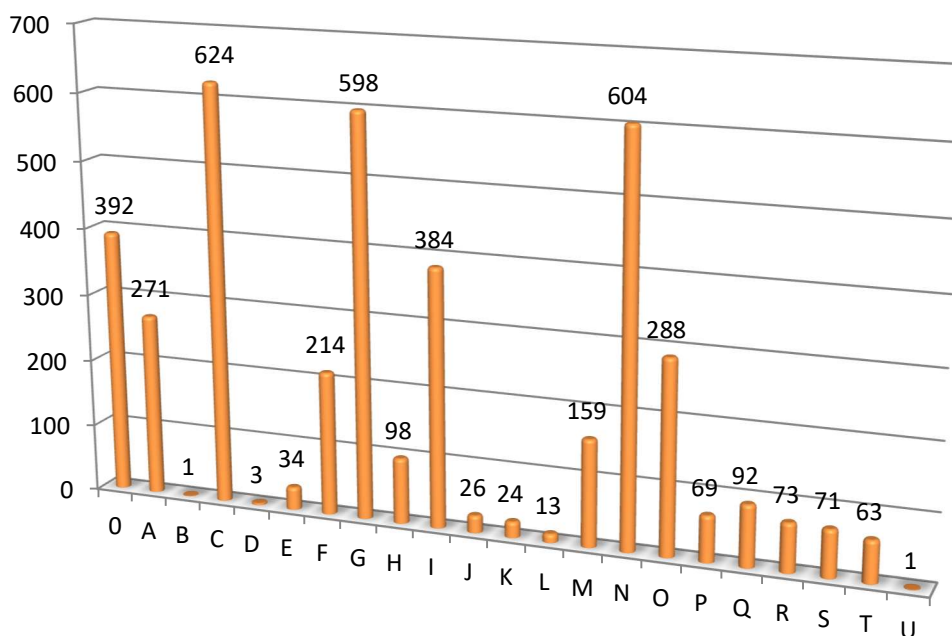


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

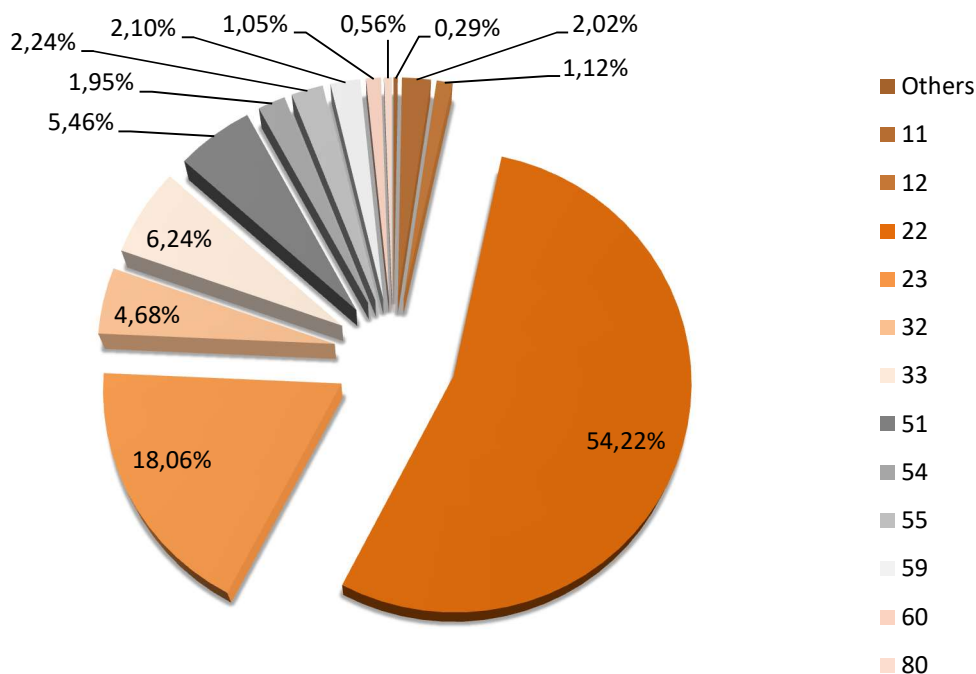


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



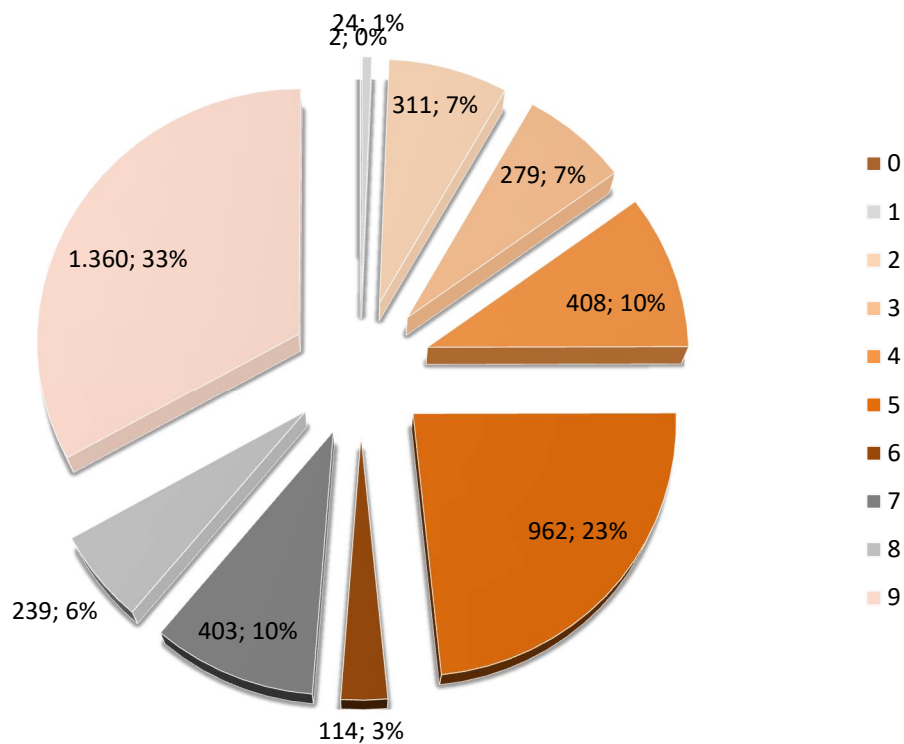

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



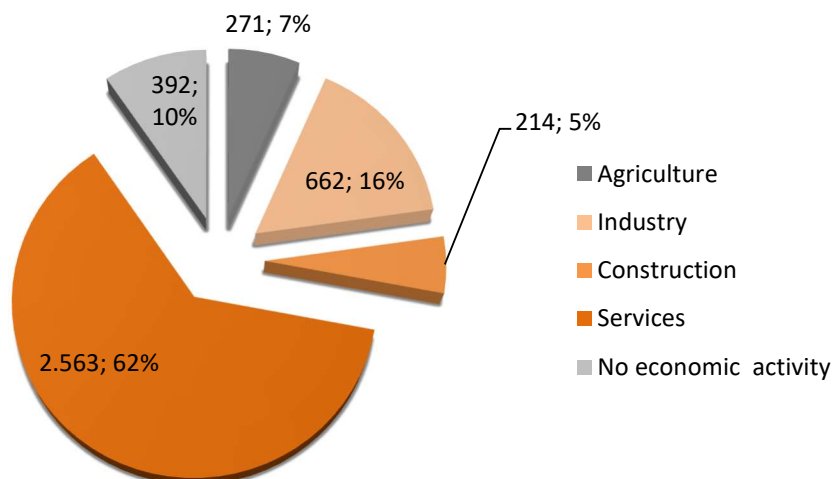

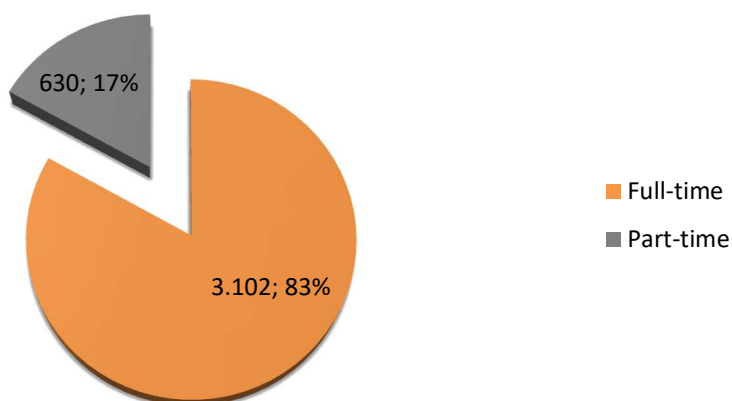

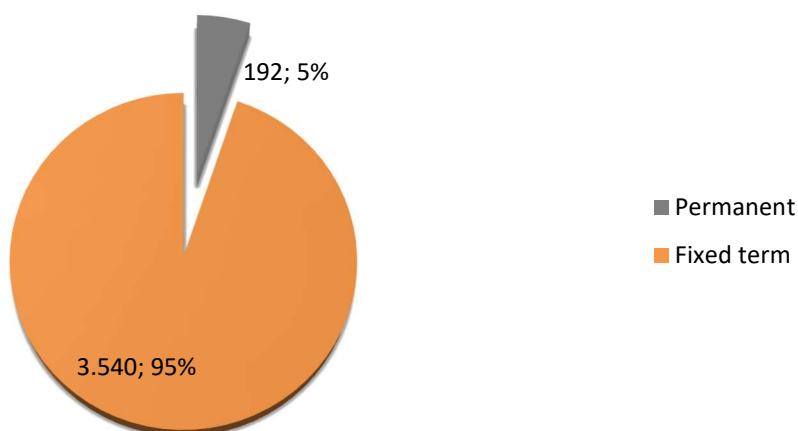

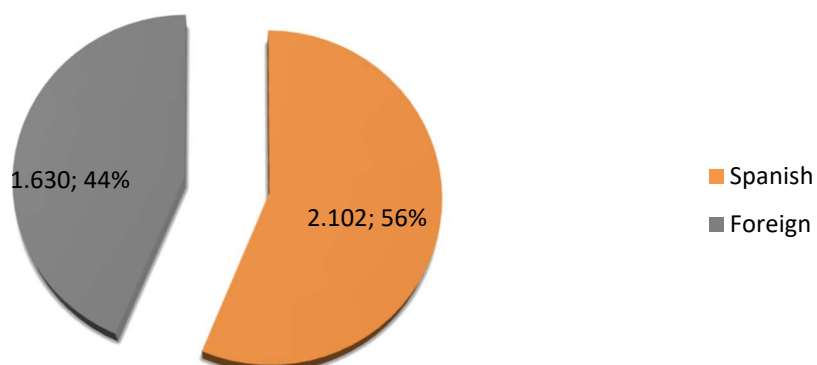
Graph 7. By type of working day



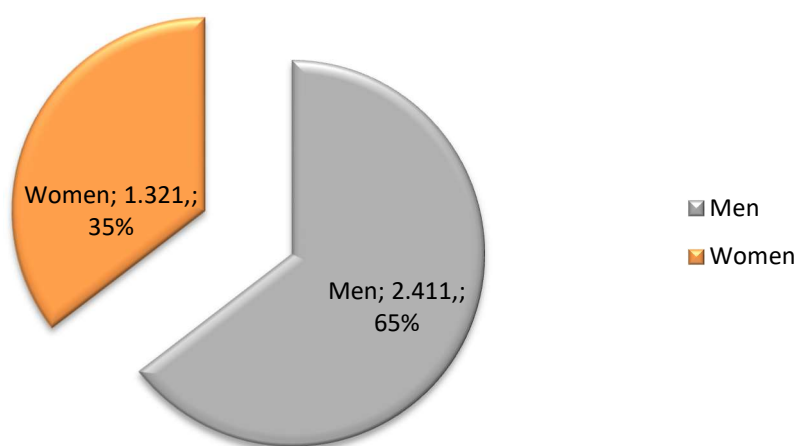

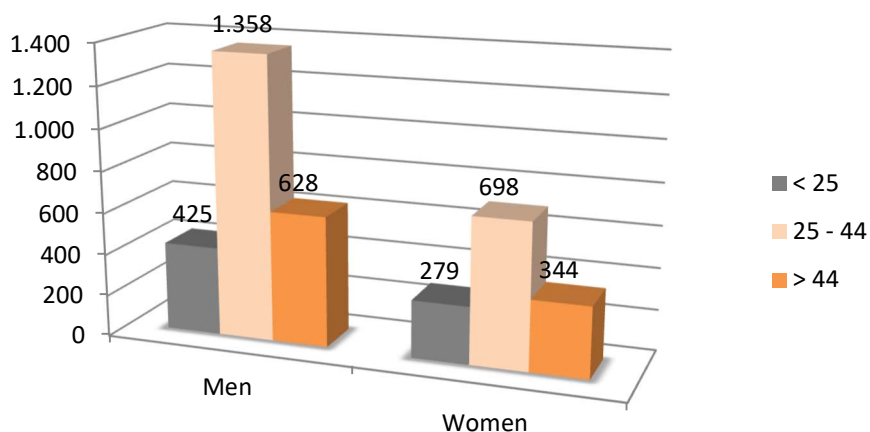

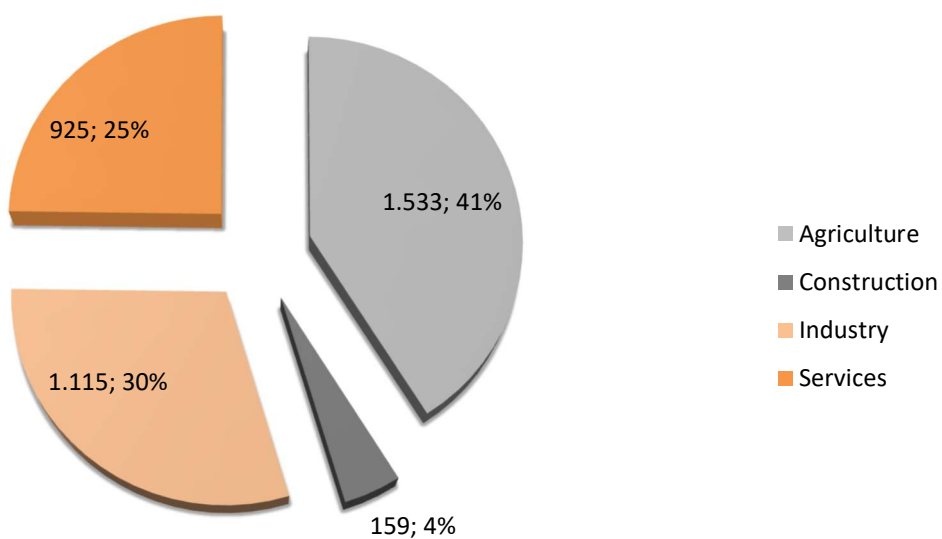

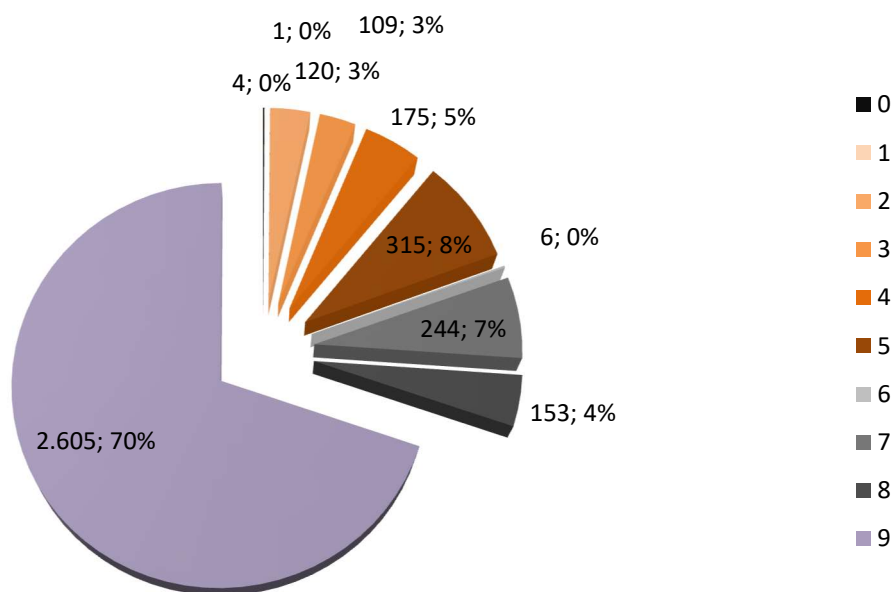

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

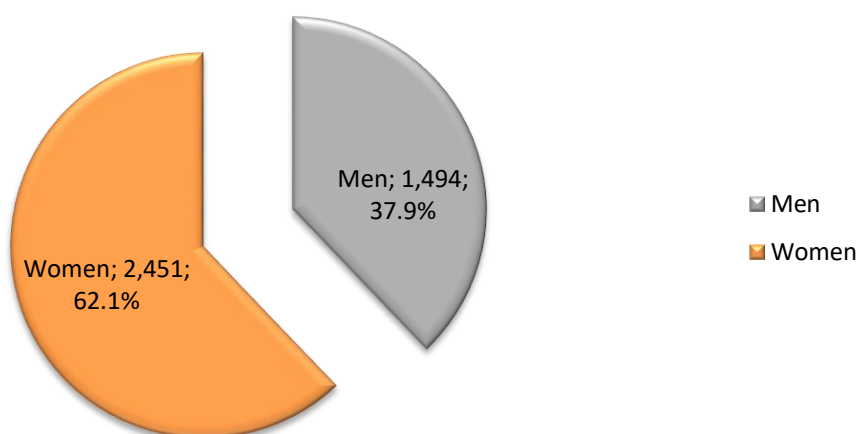
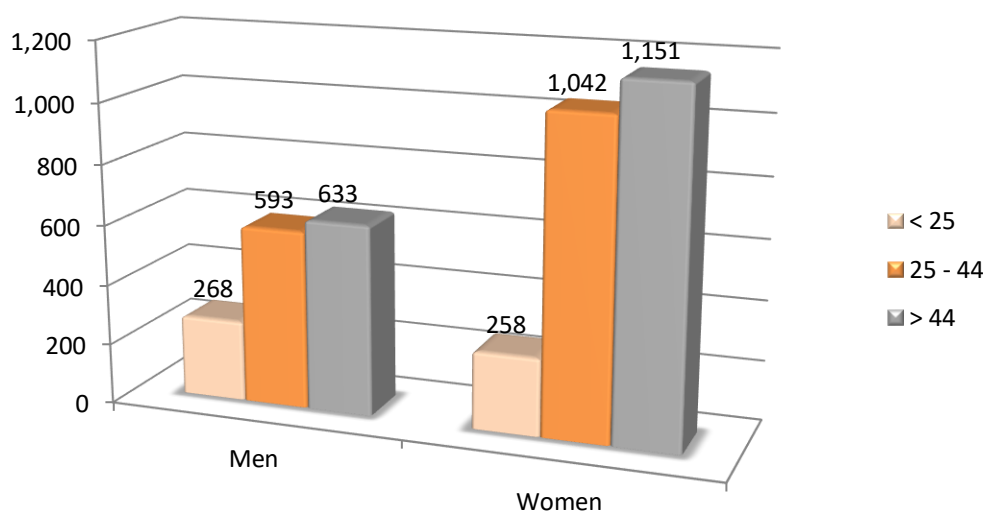
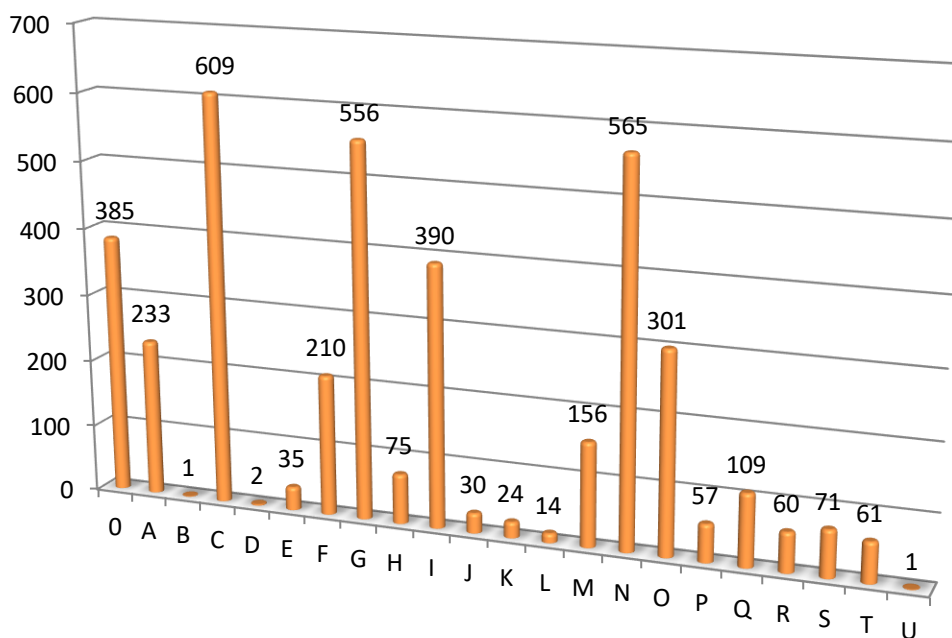


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

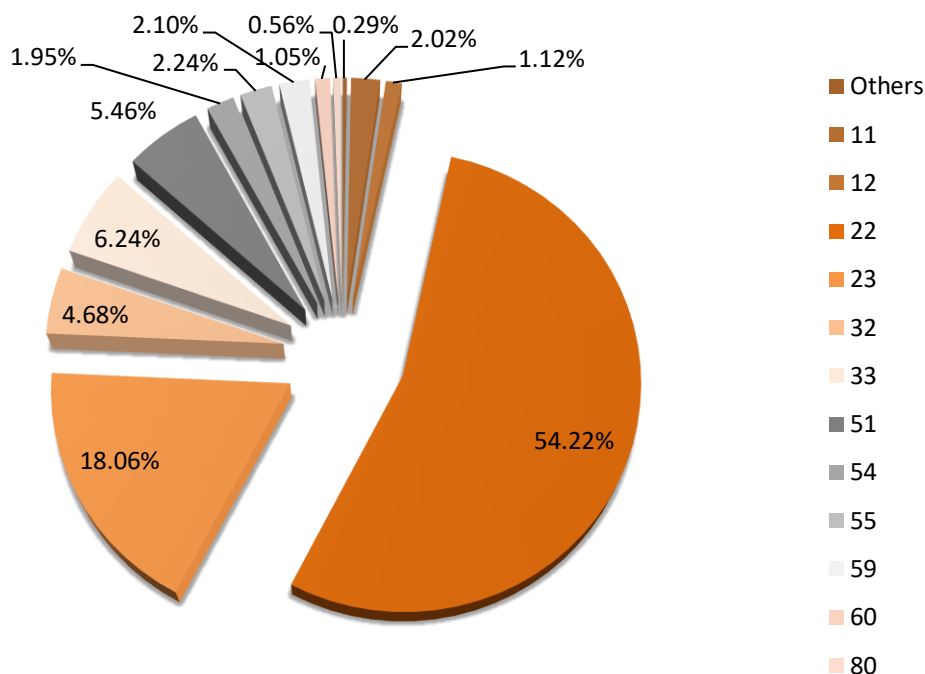


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



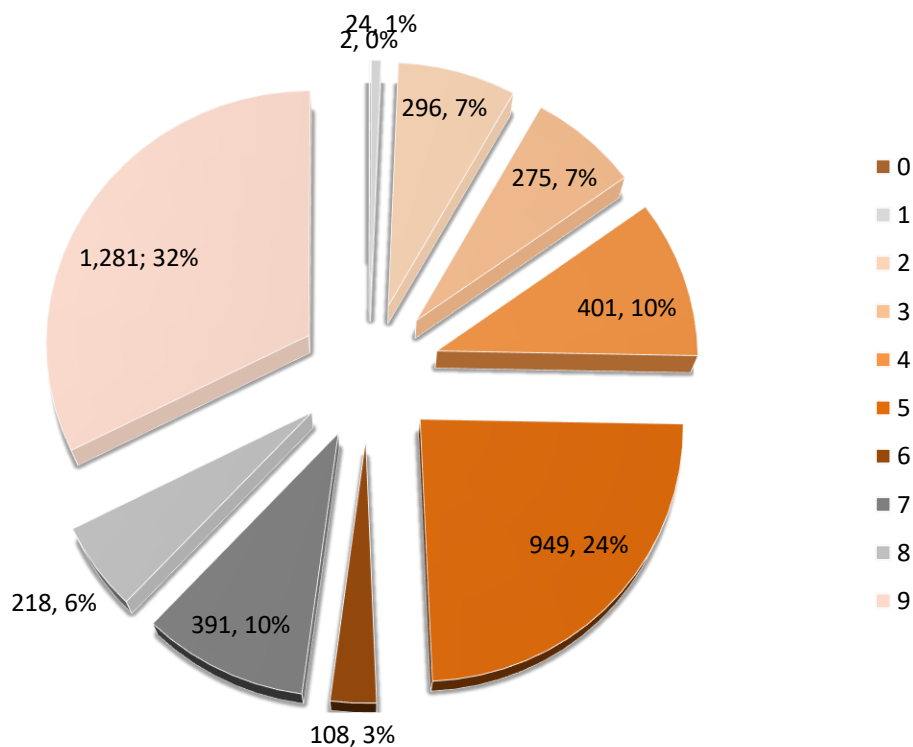

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



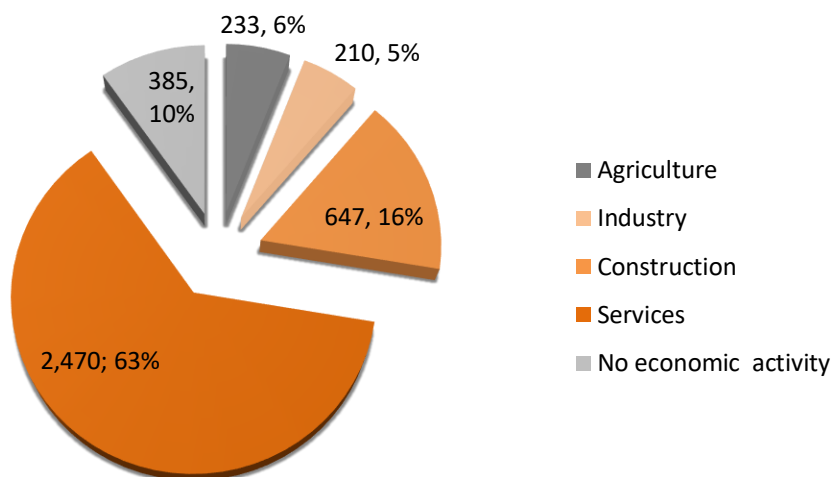

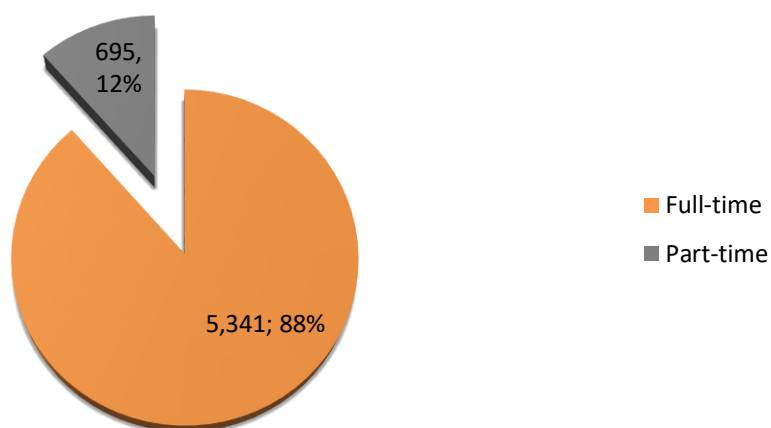

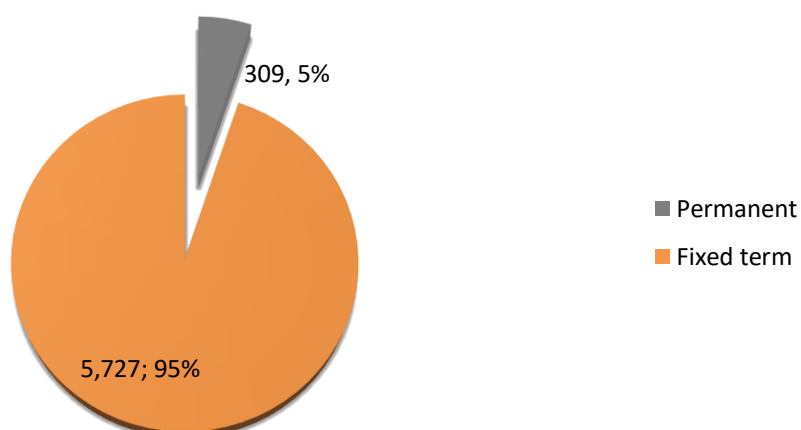

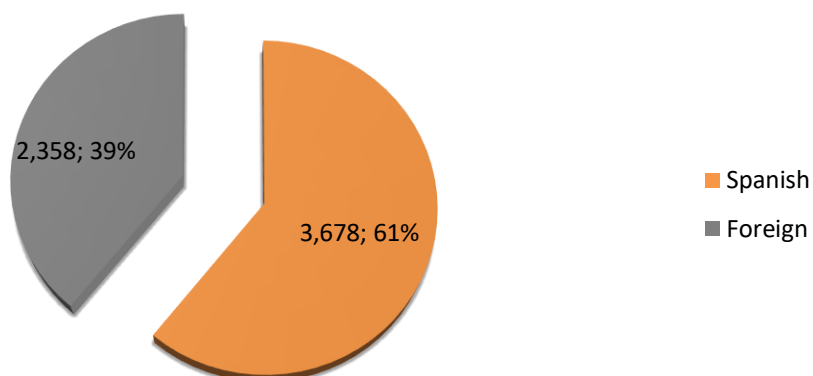
Graph 7. By type of working day



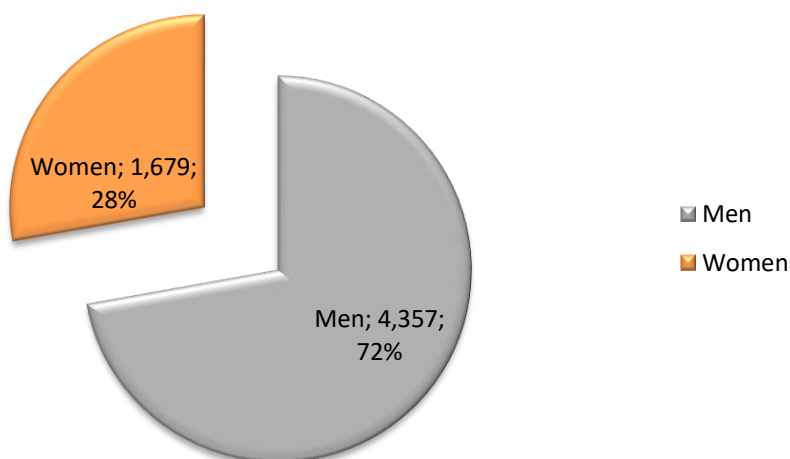

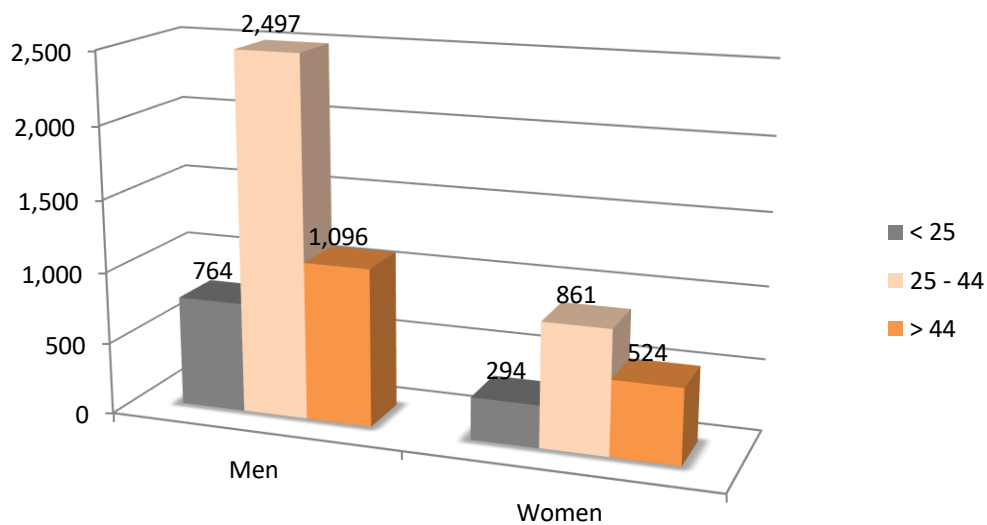

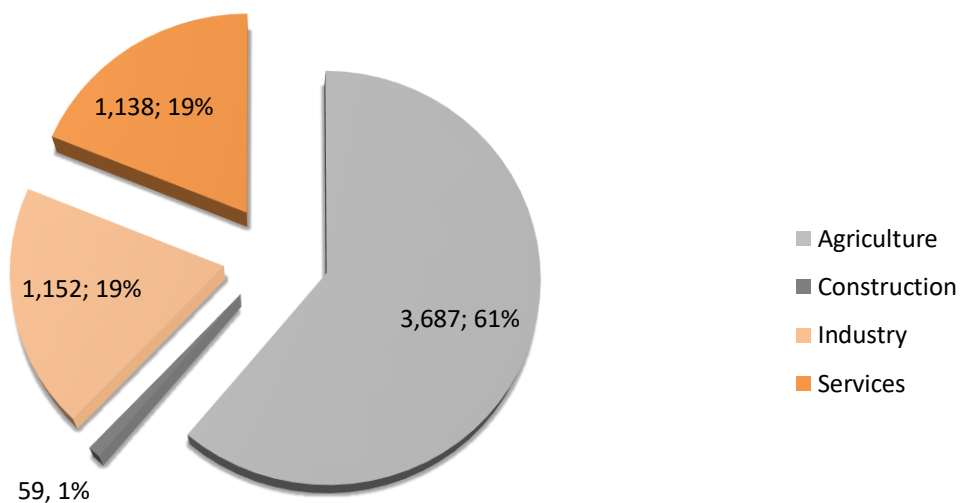

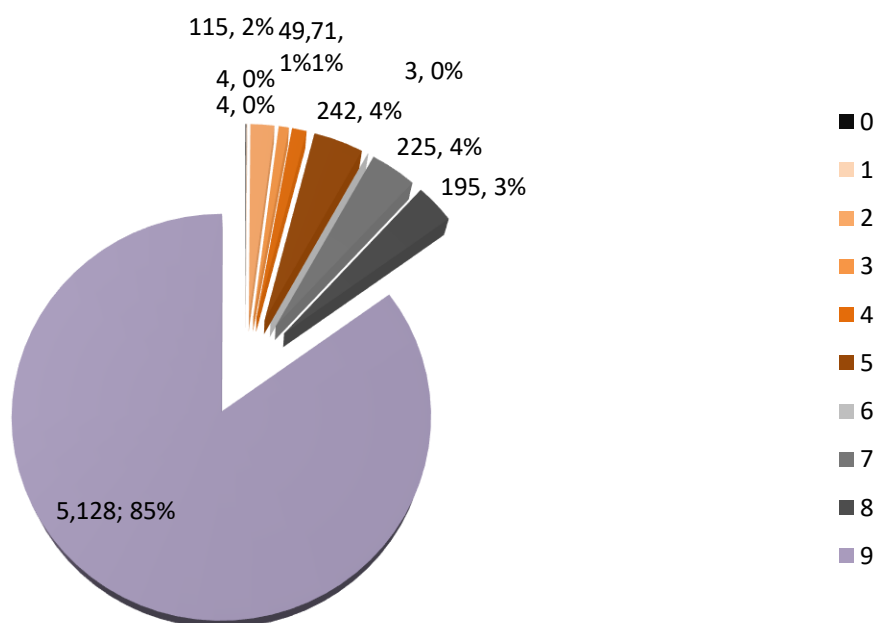

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

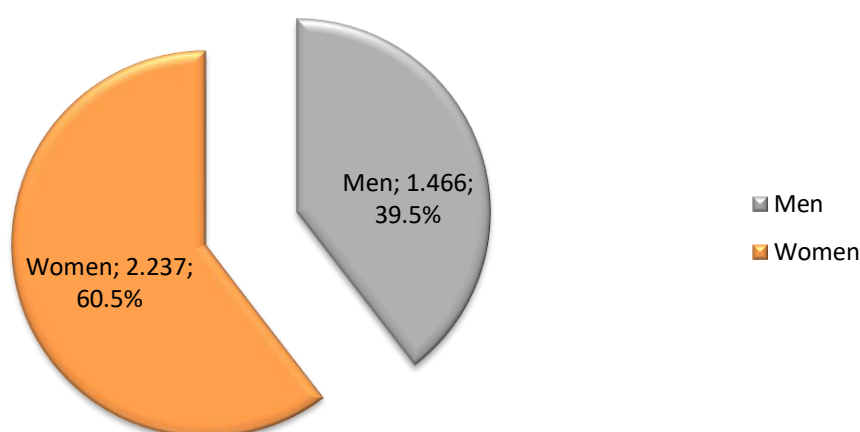
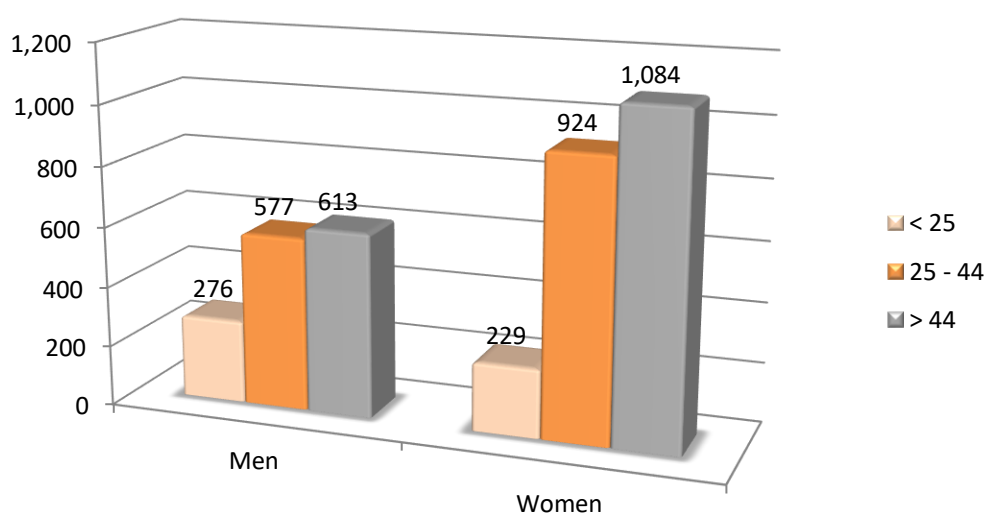
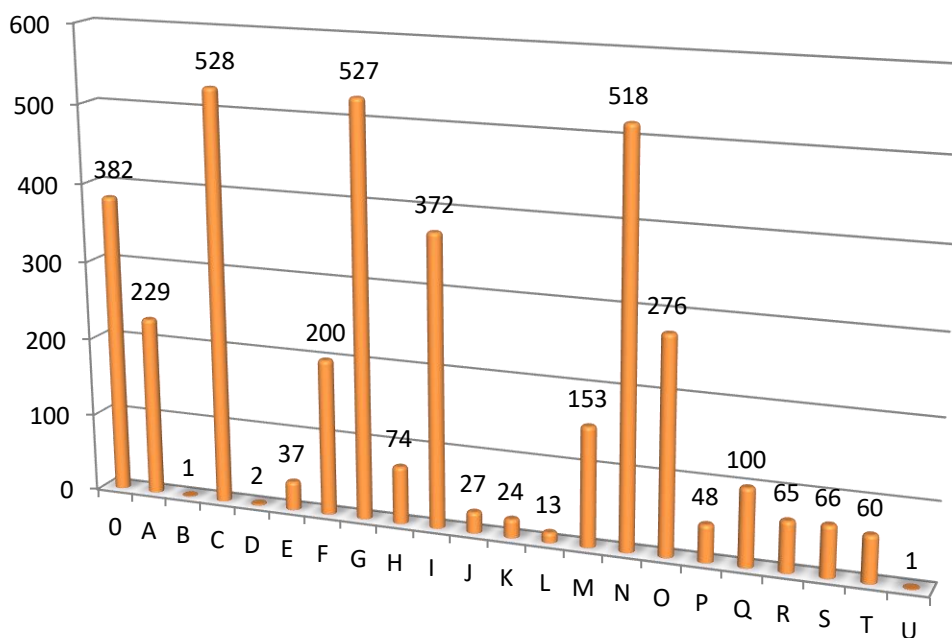


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

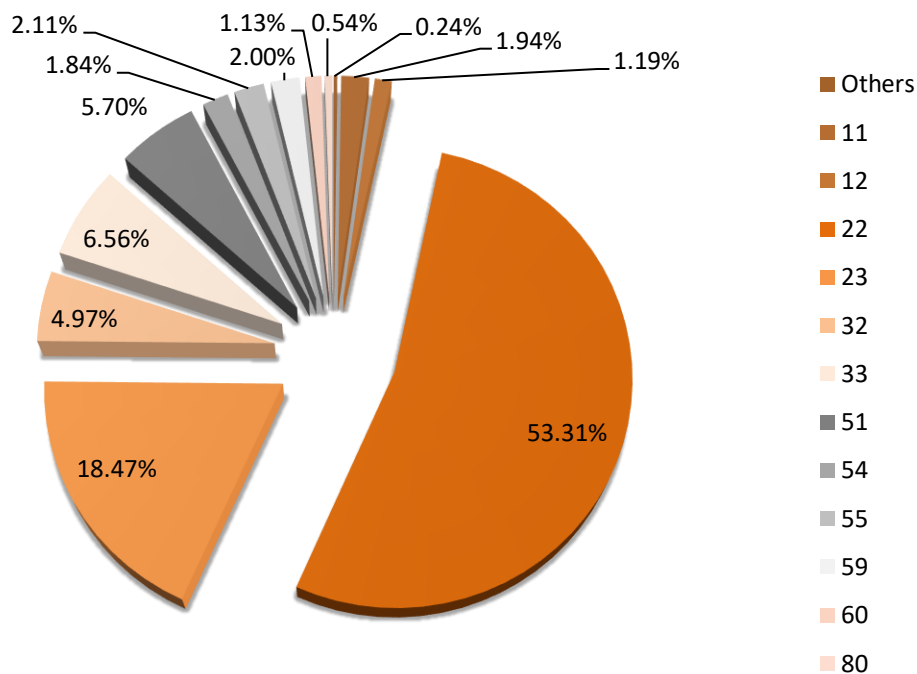


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



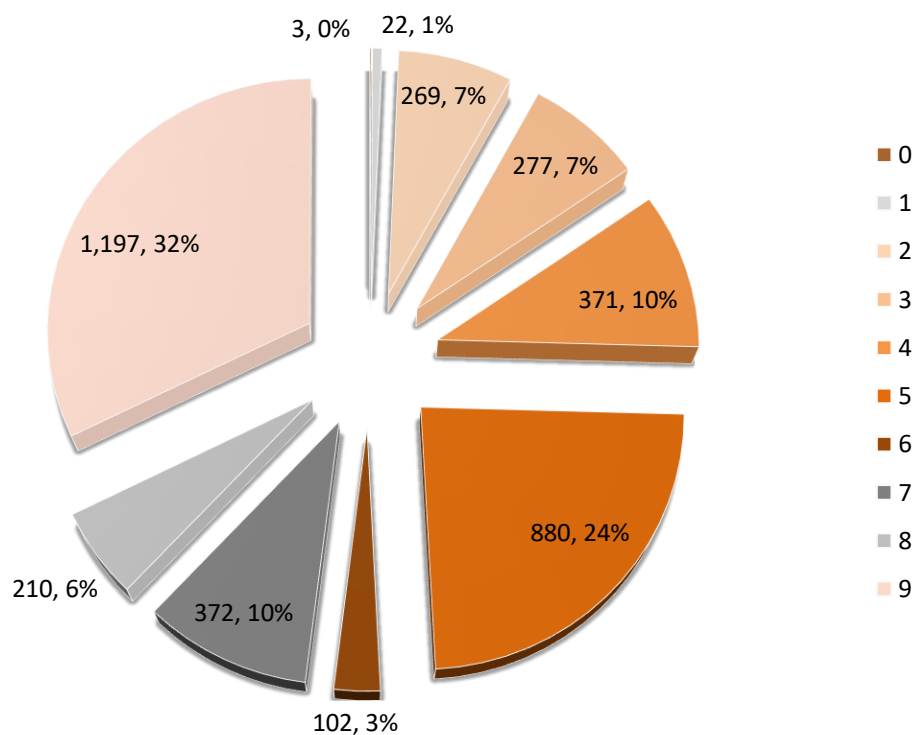

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



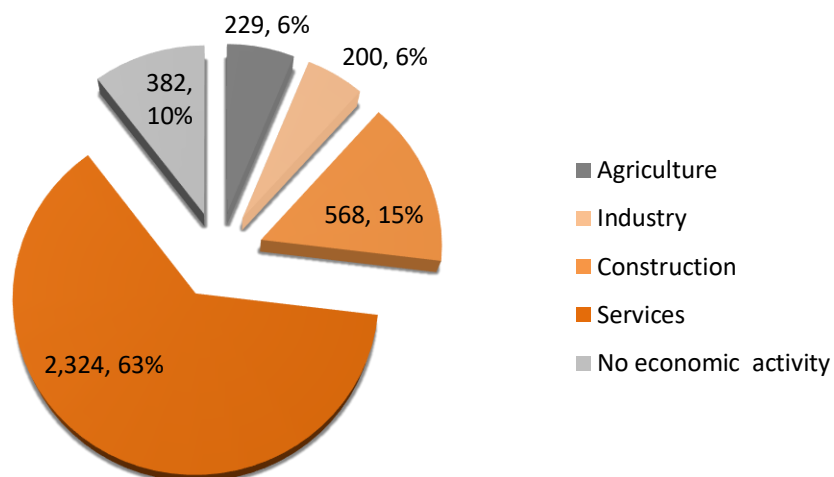

Profile summary of the unemployed (November 2020)

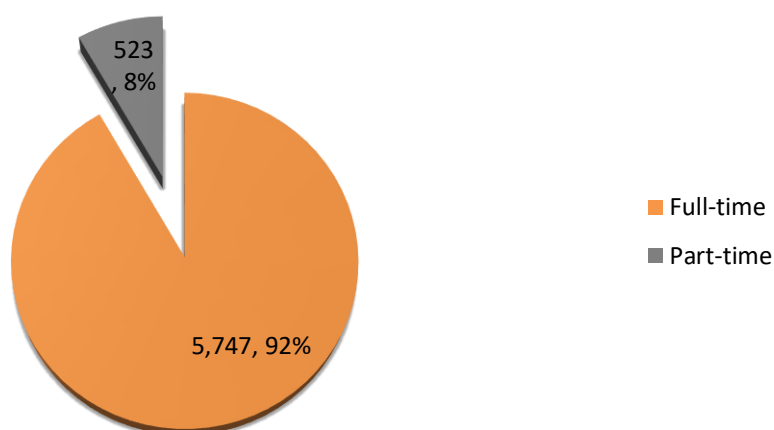
- 3,703 people were unemployed in October (39.5% men, 60.5% women). The job-seeker profile with the highest unemployment rate (53.31%) matches that of a lower education background group (high school graduate without graduate degree or equivalent). It is followed by people with GCSEs (18.47%). Following these, the following education background groups are: entry level college certificates (6.56%); high level college certificates (5.70%) in specific vocational training, plastic art and design and sports. Finally, unemployed job-seekers with higher education degrees (undergraduate and master's degrees) represent a minority (2% and 1.13%, respectively).
- These data confirm that, in November, the service sector is by far the one with the highest rate of unemployment (63%), followed by construction (15%).
- Furthermore, the results from November 2020 sorted by employment groups show that the category of elementary occupations represents the great bulk of unemployed people (32%), followed by catering, personal and protective services workers, and sellers (24%).

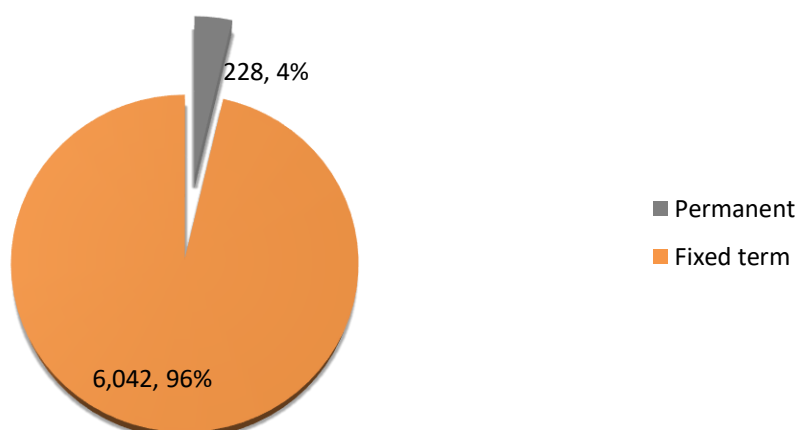

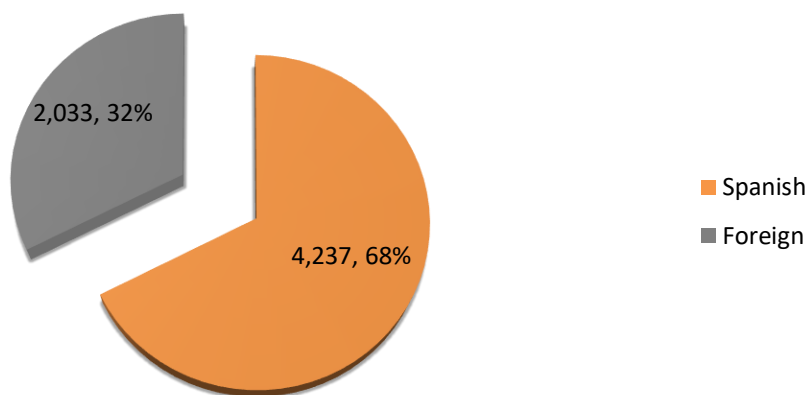
Graph 7. By type of working day



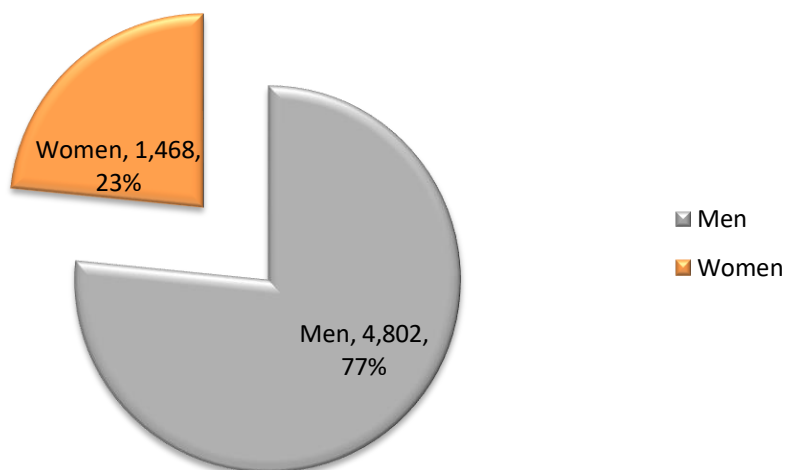
Graph 8. By type of contract



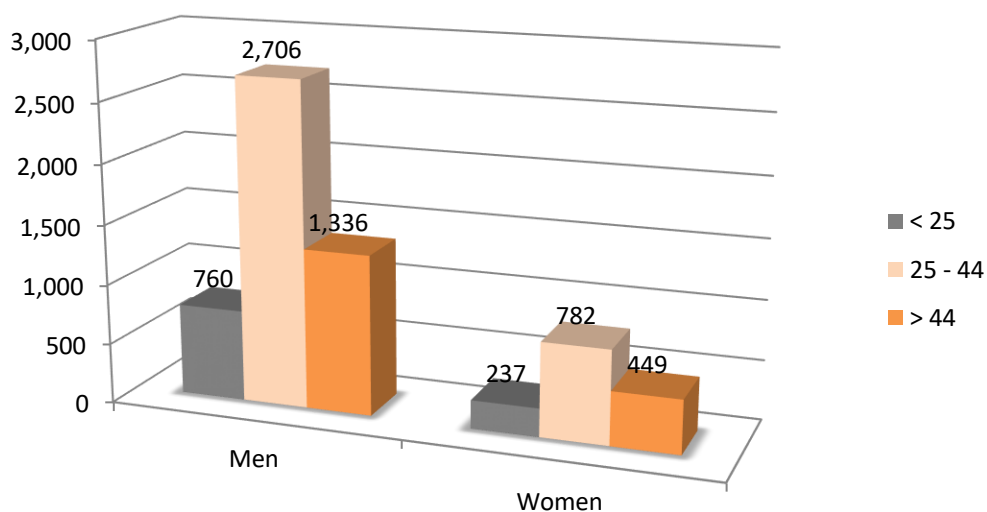
Graph 9. By nationality.



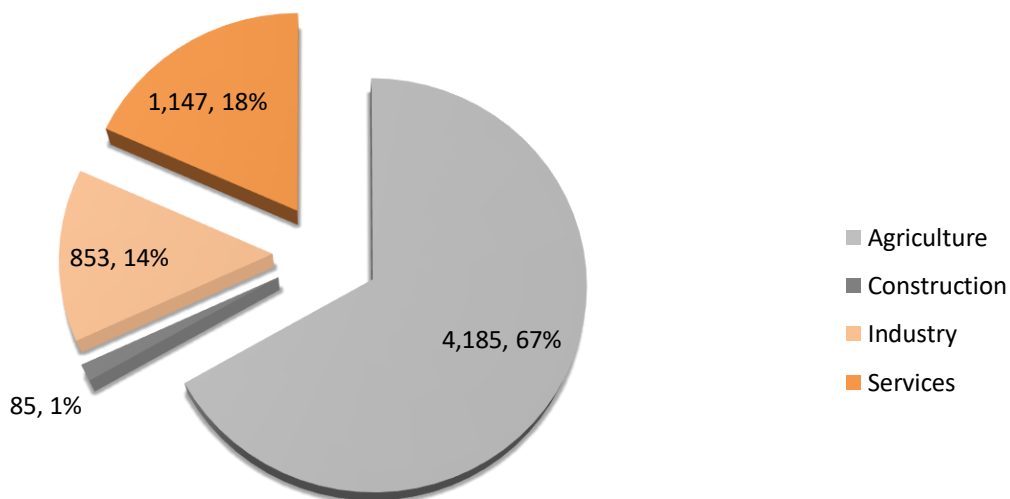
Graph 10. By gender.



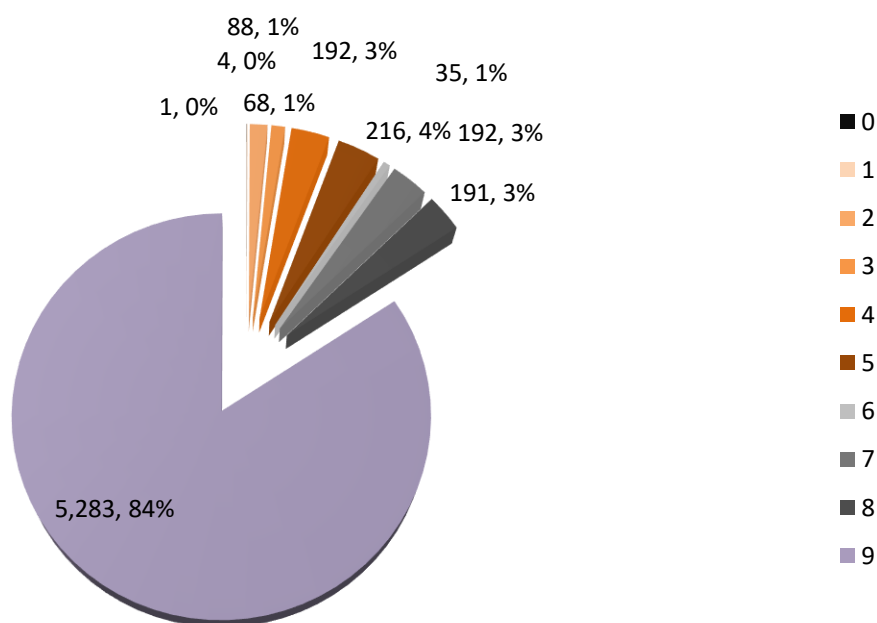
Graph 11. By age and gender.

Chart 1. Proportion of men and women job-seekers (number and percentage of the total)

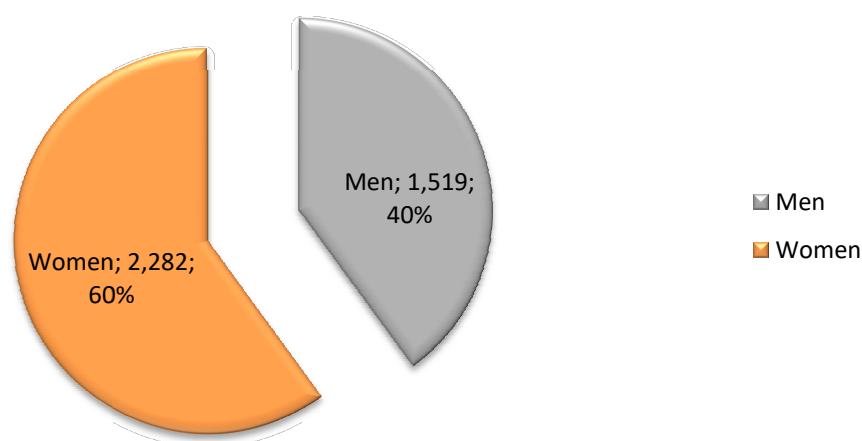
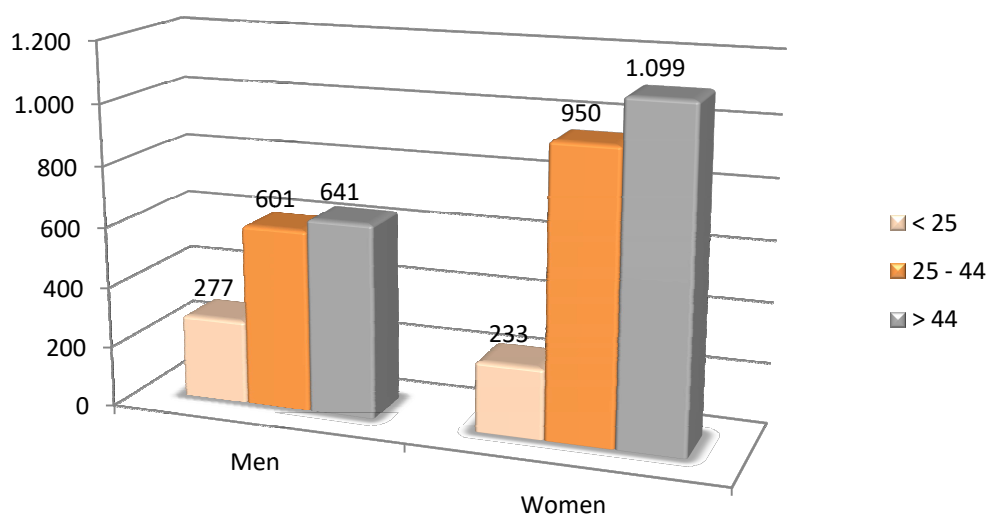
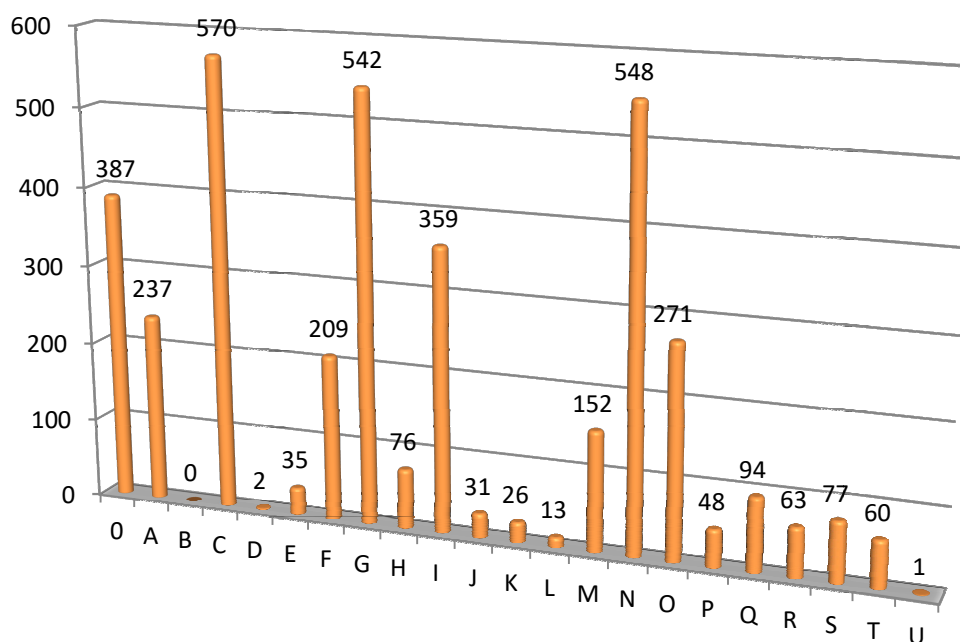


Chart 2. Unemployed job-seekers by gender and age

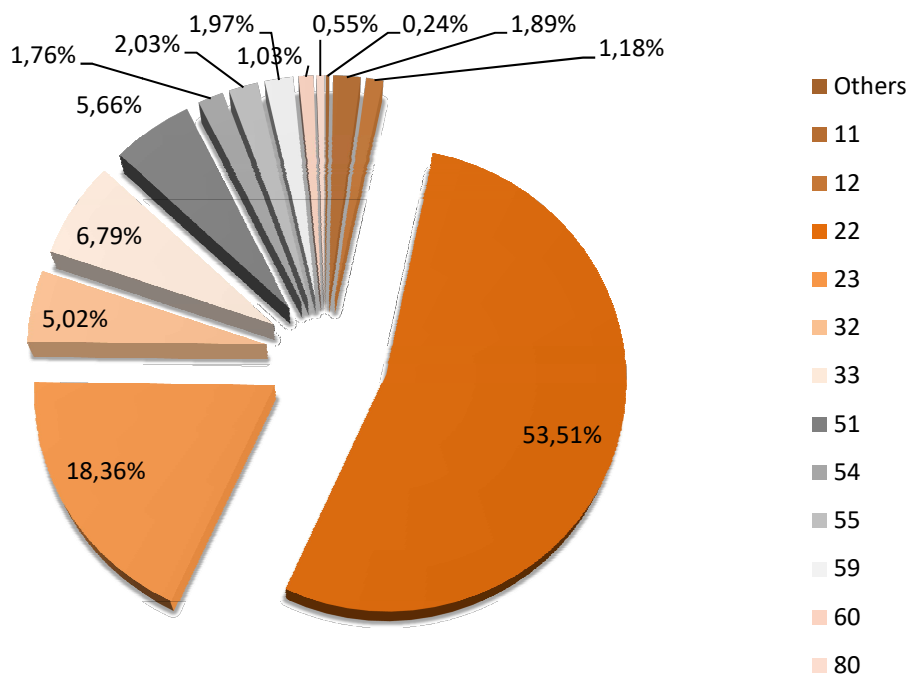


Graph 3. Distribution of unemployed/jobseekers by economic activity



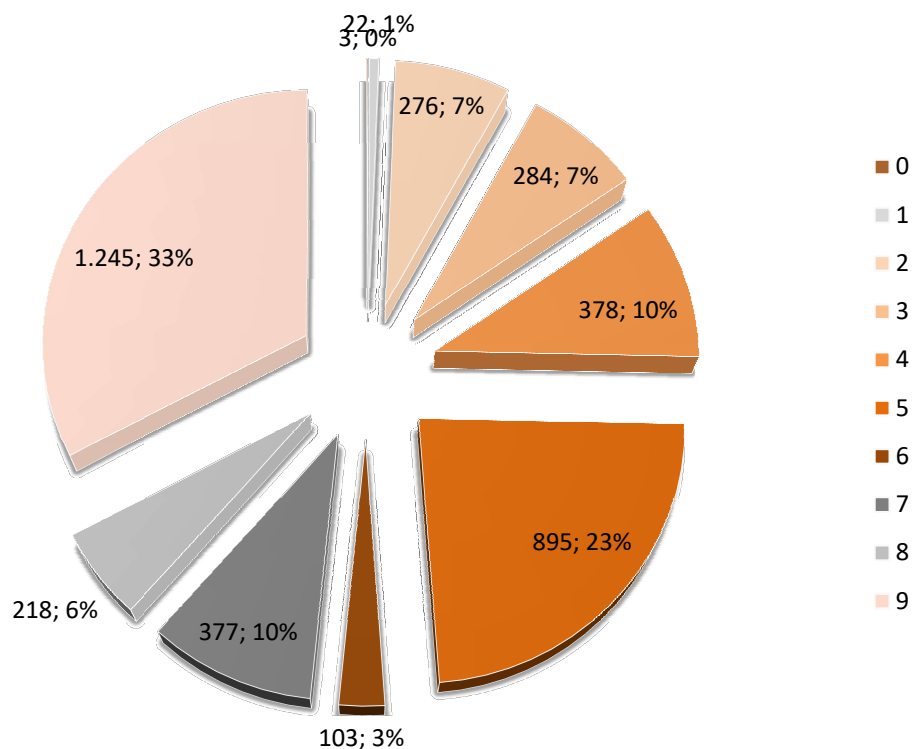

Chart 4. Distribution of job-seekers by level of education and training.



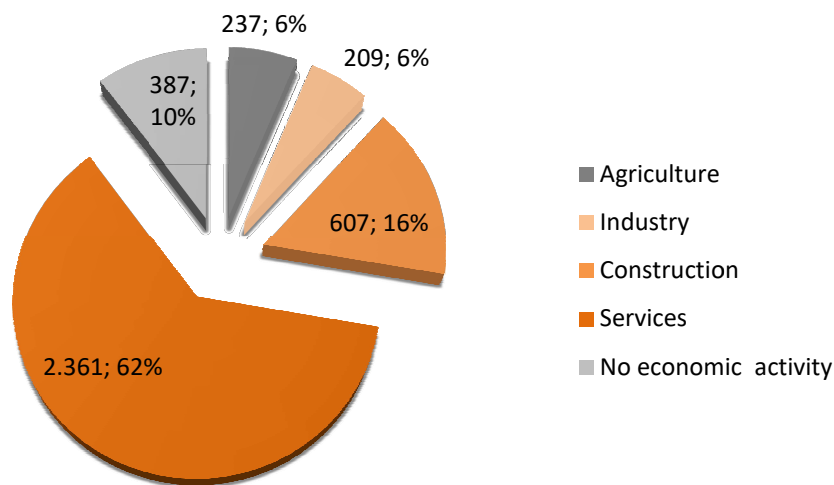

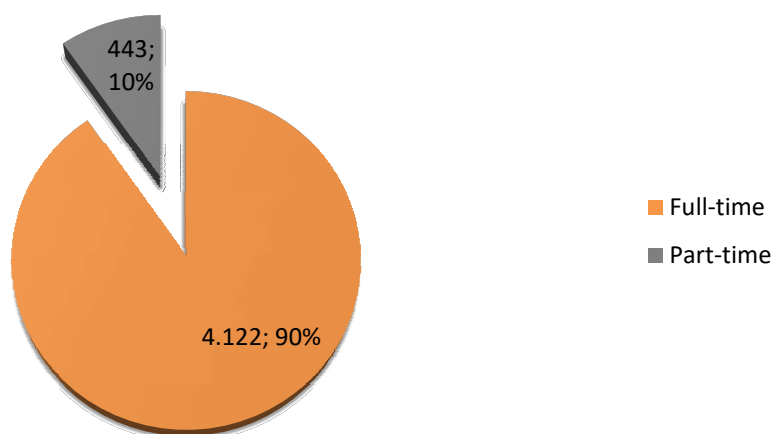

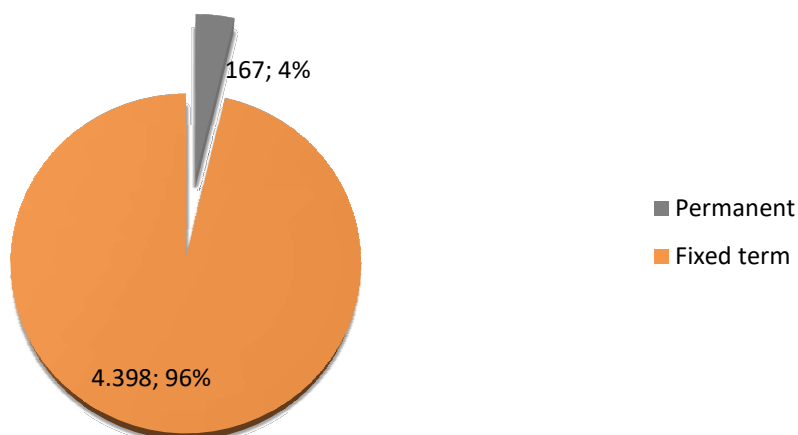

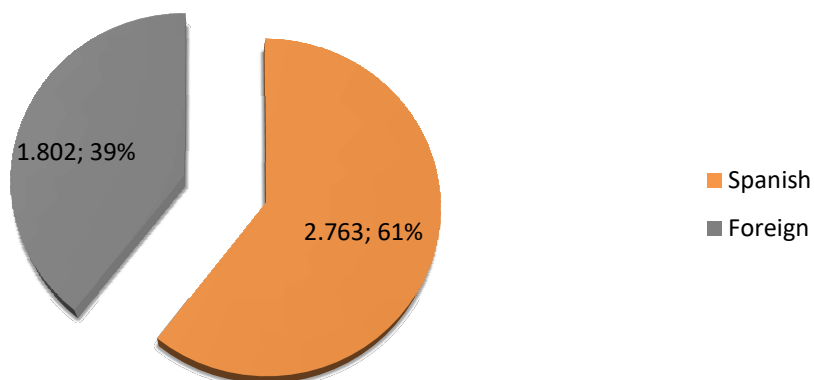
Graph 7. By type of working day



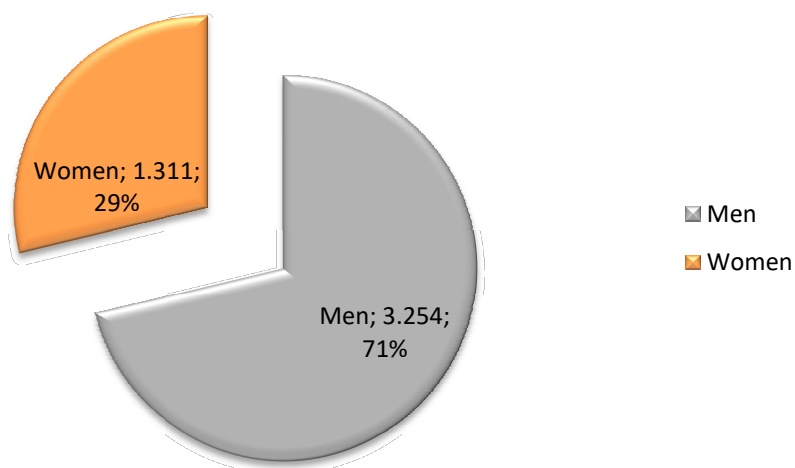
Graph 8. By type of contract



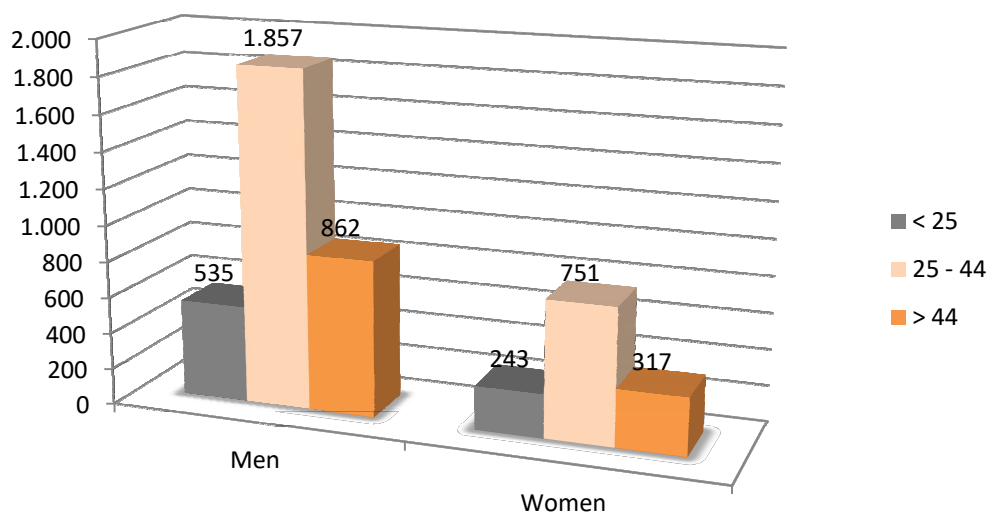

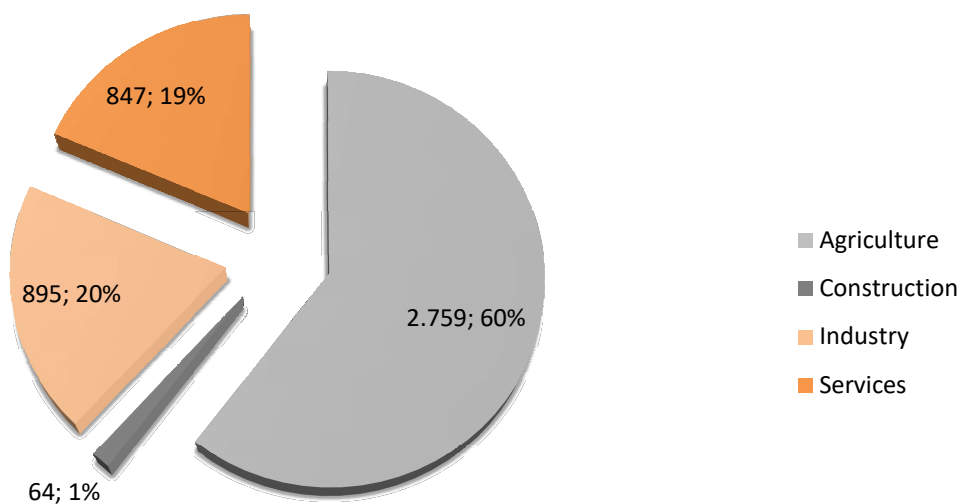
Graph 10. By gender.



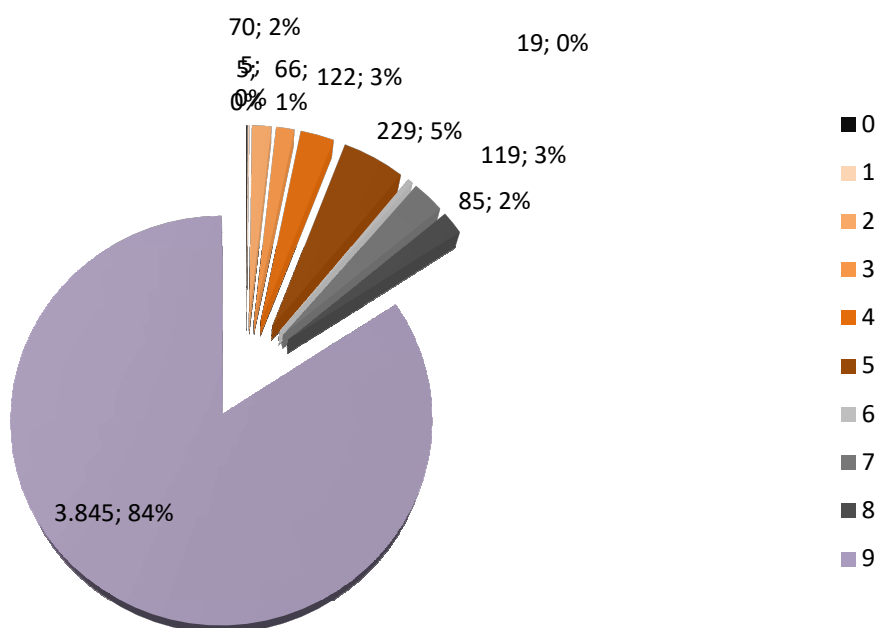
Graph 11. By age and gender.
